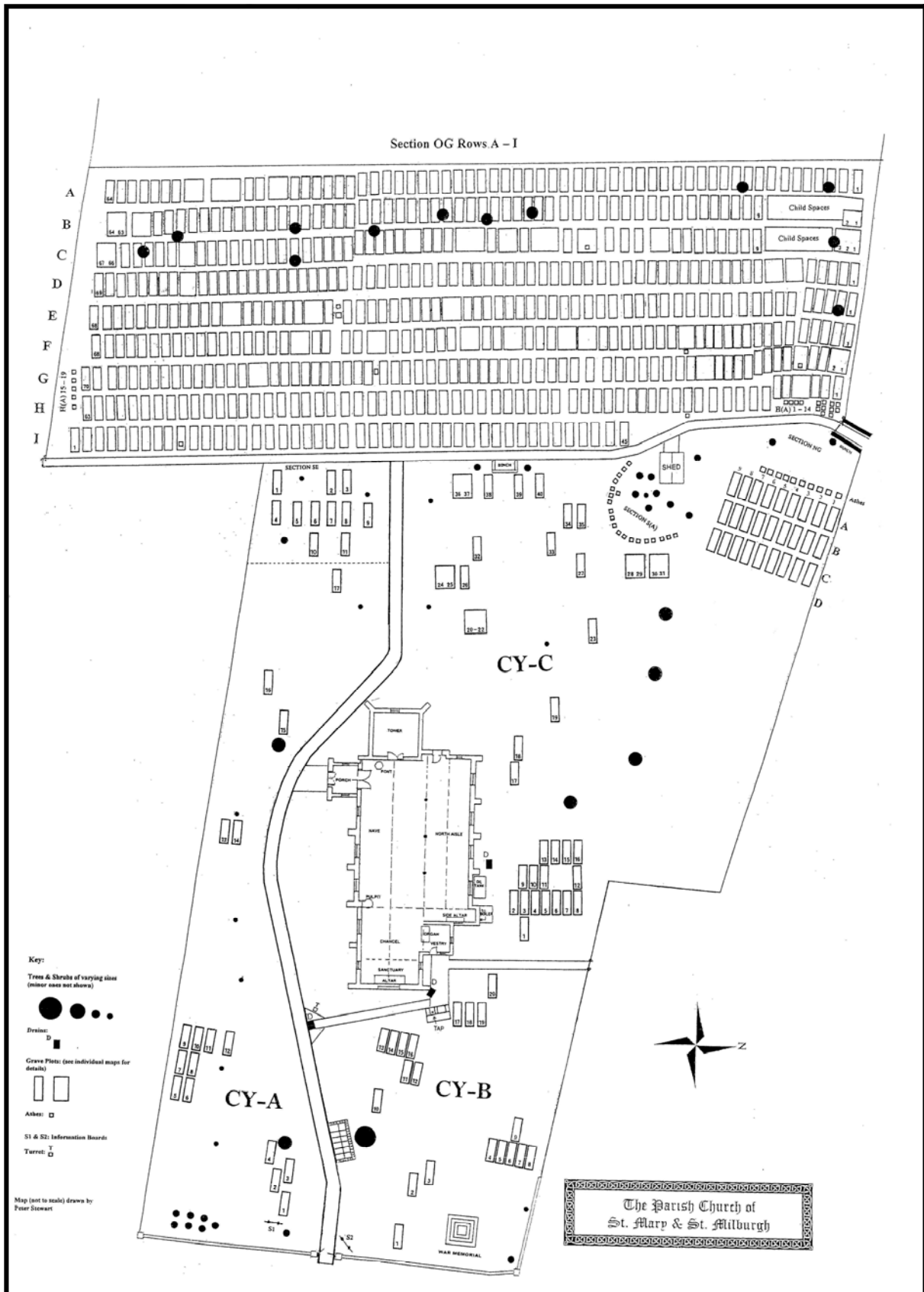

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## INTRODUCTION

The first important survey of the monumental inscriptions of St Mary & St. Milburgh Church, Offenham was carried out in 1984 by a team of volunteers from the Birmingham & Midland Society for Genealogy & Heraldry. Despite containing some errors and incomplete inscriptions it is still a valuable document as a number of monuments recorded during that survey are no longer readable. There are many fragments of monuments in the churchyard and surrounds; some making up the rockery against the eastern wall of the church with others used as a pathway and kerbing in the vicarage garden. Other more complete stones, mainly footstones, are alongside or under the rubbish spoil; some of these marry up with parent stones still *in situ* in the churchyard. A notebook containing some inscriptions is among the documents relating to Offenham which were deposited in the Worcester Record Office some years ago. This book is dated 1928, and while it is rather amateurishly written and incomplete, proved invaluable in establishing the presence of many more monuments in churchyard that no longer exists today.

Before embarking on this survey the original burial registers were consulted, and in doing so was able to correct previous errors regarding names and dates, and to add a number of missing ages to the registers. Also unlike the previous members of the survey I was able to devote more time to examining each monument and clean where needed. All the monuments were digitally photographed which enabled me to read worn or faded inscriptions on my computer. It was then decided that this volume should contain all those photographs for future reference as since this survey began, in early 2006, an even greater number of stones are no longer readable and some have been broken or have succumbed to frost damage. Cox (1953) states "*There were a dozen or more memorials in the old church but one small one of these was transferred to the new church and this can be seen in the vestry. I have been unable to trace what happened to these old memorials – they seem to have just disappeared like many of the ancient tombstones.*" Cox does not give details of this monument but probably refers to the wall plaque hanging in the vestry [Plate 35] which commemorates the death of Edward Kenwrick and his wife Ann. However, during my searches I uncovered a further two monuments, both ledgers and both hidden beneath carpet. One is located alongside the organ and the other in the vestry [Plates 36 & 37].

### **The Church and Churchyard 1848 - 1861**

The history of the church has been well covered in other publications but is it worth repeating here a shortened version of the impressions of the church and churchyard by the Rev. Canon Lawson who was presented to the living in the spring of 1848. For the full account see Cox (1953) and Laight (2008).

*'I can well remember my first view of Offenham church, when, in the spring of 1848, the perpetual curacy fell to my option as a student of Christ Church. It consisted of tower, nave, and chancel, with a porch on the north side. The exterior had a look of neglect and advancing decay and on the south side were two rough modern buttresses of blue stone; and in the roof on the same side had been inserted two dormer windows of the same character as those in the neighbouring cottages. On the gable the nave stood an open gabled Sanctus bell turret, capped by a finial which had not belonged to it, and had probably come from a pinnacle of the tower. [Plate 18] A similar finial surmounted the chancel gable, and two or three others were lying in a niche in the porch.*

*The perpendicular tower was in pretty good repair, excepting as to the mullions of the windows and the pinnacles. In the upper part of it much of the wall stone seemed to have been laid without mortar. On the west side a low, narrow, square-headed door had been inserted in order to admit the ringers without passing through the church, and this undermined and dislocated a rather pretty little window immediately over the modern doorway.*

*Inside, the nave was filled with a variety of seatings; here and there were some roughly hewn oak benches with plain backs and square ends, being no doubt survivals of the original type. Some of them had been replaced by elm seating with doors, but interspersed among the humbler sort were several lofty square pews, each of which had devoured two or three of the bench spaces, and which were mostly framed in deal partitions and lined with baize that had once been green.*

*The reading desk was entered by two or three high steps and led by a few more to the pulpit, close to which, and attached to the south wall, was a rusty iron frame for holding the hour glass, by which the preachers of former days are said to have regulated the lengths of their sermons. Underneath the reading desk was a compartment for the parish clerk, so narrowed by the encroachment of a neighbouring pew that he had to sit with his face to the north, and the book board for his big prayer book was attached to the door of his little den.*

*A western gallery, supported by two iron pillars, was reached by a flight of stairs from the tower and was occupied by the male and female members of the choir, and a few other men and lads. The instrumental music, so far as I remember, was a flute, clarionet and base viol. Before the erection of the gallery, the nave had been connected with the tower by an open archway, with some shallow ornamental incision in the spandrils on the east side; but when this was blocked up by the*



gallery, the communication was reduced to a low and narrow deal door, in which was inserted a glass bull's-eye, in order that the clerk, who was also sexton, might be aware of the clergyman's entrance into his desk.

The perpendicular octagonal font stood in about the centre of the nave, between the north door and a recess in the south wall, which indicated that there had once been an entrance on that side; but the encroachment of pews had so blocked up the space on either side of it, that, in order, it was said, to enable of one the five bells, after re-casting, to be carried past it, part of a north-eastern angle had been cut away. The lead lining had been removed, and the modern but worm-eaten lid which covered it, and was used at funerals and other services as a hat-stand, concealed not only a number of torn notices and other papers, but also a small plain basin which was used for baptisms.

The chancel arch appeared to have been narrow, but the south pier had been entirely cut away, and the space it had occupied was included in the area of a pew which extended from the back of the reading desk to the chancel door. On the north side the opening had been squared, and an aperture in the pier, supposed to have been a hagioscope, had been covered over with whitewashed boarding. Over what had been the arch, on the western side, was a gorgeous blazonry of the royal arms, dating from the last or the early part of the present century.

In the chancel beside the pew and the door above mentioned, were, on the north side, the incumbent's pew, and one on each side of it, west and east, all constructed roughly in elm; also some high oak rails of a homely character. The pew nearest the east end cut off a portion of these rails, which formed one side of it, as it occupied space which should have been left between them and the incumbent's pew; consequently the door of it, opening southwards, was kept closed by a wooden "button" attached to the rails. This seat had been made by my predecessor, Canon Digby, in order that, when he was in residence, he might have his housekeeper sitting near him in state, the seat for the other parsonage servants being under the gallery at the west end. Within the rails was a rudely-framed table, which, in honour of the late incumbent, was, like the reading-desk and pulpit, draped in black cloth, and over which, four times a year, a tattered covering was spread out on "Sacrament Sundays," when a black bottle was placed upon it with a battered silver chalice and two pewter plates, which were indiscriminately used for the bread and the collection of alms. Against the south wall within the rails was a small piscine of graceful type, corbelled by the mutilated figure of an angel, and coated over with whitewash, which was afterwards transferred to the vestry of the new church; and from the north side of the east wall projected a narrow stone bracket, which I used as a credence table.

Among the traces of an older building was the sill of the east window, forming a string-course carved into a sort of nail-headed moulding, thickly encrusted with whitewash. In the floor of the sacristy were a few defaced old tiles, some incised gravestones, and a large fragment of yellow stone, which had formed part of the ancient altar.

The walls of the church, both nave and chancel, were held together with whitewashed tie-beams, but had obviously slipped away from the grasp of these, owing to the superincumbent thrust of the heavy stone-slate roof, and had so decided an outward leaning from the top that an ecclesiastical curate in the neighbourhood hazarded a theory they had been built so originally, in order to symbolise the character of the church as that of a ship or ark.

The churchyard had been of considerable extent early in the century, but it was claimed by some layman as his freehold, and was purchased from him by Canon Digby, who then undertook to decide that only a certain portion of it had been consecrated ground, and enclosed a strip on the northside to enlarge the parsonage garden. Three other slips on the south, east and west sides he also shut off with rough paling, and left only an inner square of scanty dimensions for burial ground. These four strips together with an adjoining close and orchard, he left by his will to be purchased for the incumbent as glebe at a price of £300, and the purchase was made out of funds belonging to the benefice.

The churchyard was badly kept, and soil with a rank growth of nettles stood high against the walls of the church. On the south side was a raised flat tombstone of the seventeenth century, which was a constant seat of playtable for children in memory of Thomas Haslewood, Esq. (Eldest son of Sir Thomas Haslewood) who died 10<sup>th</sup> January, 1723. Nash says that the Haslewoods succeeded the descendants of Sir Philip Hoby, to whom Offenham was granted at the dissolution. I think their armorial bearings were also to be found in a carved oak chimney piece at the Court Farm. Near this memorial were four upright tombstones, side by side, forming a solid wall of obstruction, sacred to the memories of various members of a local family; and one of them bore this desponding utterance, which almost seems to imply the provision of an impending purgatory for the perpetrator of three false concords in four lines :-

*"My quivering lips hang feebly down,  
My pulse are faint and few;  
Then slowly, with a dismal groan,  
I bid this world adieu,"*

[Note: No stone bearing this inscription found]

On the north side, nearly opposite the east window, quaintly and tersely recorded the life and death of "Mr. Anthony Buggin, of this parish and Elizabeth his wife, who both are laid together here to rest till the resurrection." What follows

*has made the stone a shrine, as it were, for the pilgrimage of many a pair of youthful lovers: "Love and marriage made them one in the bud of youth, when he was 15, shee but 14 years old, Ann, Dom. 1628. They lived married 53 years, blessed with ten children, &c." [Plate 116]*

*On my first visit to the church I determined that something be done to make it less unseemly as a place of worship; but I soon found there would little or no response on the part of the parishioners to efforts in this direction. I induced the churchwardens to let me order a suitable covering and linen cloth for the Holy Table; and when my first child was born I had the chalice restored, and offered a flagon and paten. I also repaired the font, and the broken mullions and pinnacles of the tower; and beyond this, I judged it best not to palliate the deformities of the fabric, but to wait for a more favourable epoch, and be putting by funds against its arrival.*

*I think it was about 1855 that, after consultation with Mr. F. Preedy, architect, a native of the parish, I invited the leading parishioners to meet him and consider proposals for attempting the restoration of the church, but I soon found that such proposals would meet with no material support, and must be laid aside for further ripening. So I continued to wait in hope, and made it a matter of daily prayer that my heart's desire might be granted me.*

*In 1860 the parochial mind had become more familiar with the idea of what a church ought to be, my circle of friends in the diocese had been greatly enlarged, and I had put by a considerable amount to serve as a nucleus. So I again called the chief parishioners into council on the subject, offering £200 on my own part, and the assurance of help from many friends. After a little hesitation, the proposal of re-building the nave was heartily taken up, and we formed a small committee, with the following subscriptions promised in addition to my own: - Lieutenant-Colonel Digby, £100; Mr. Gibbs, £100; Mr. W.D. Sheaf, £100; Mr. T. Sheaf, £100; Mr. Myatt, £50; Mr. Hopkins, £40; Mrs. Stillingfleet, £20. Eventually, nearly all in the parish, or connected with it, gave liberally according to their means, the amount from cottagers, varying from 1s. to 1ls, being nearly £15, and the total of parochial contributions was more than £900. Besides this, the re-building of the chancel was undertaken by the Dean and Chapter of Christchurch, Oxford and Colonel Digby as their lessee of the great tithes, at the estimated cost of £280.*

*Then we went to the public outside the parish, and obtained £313 odd; also for the Worcester Church Extension Society £100, and from the Incorporated Church Building Society £50. I had, moreover, reserved a large slice of my savings for special features and adjuncts, and this was liberally added to by many relations and friends. The east window was the gift of Mrs. Clarke, Lanesfield, and two other windows on the north side were filled with painted glass at the cost of members of the Preedy family.*

*Mr. Preedy was the architect, and also the artist for the windows. The tender of Mr. James Griffiths, builder, Eldersfield, was accepted, and the building began early in 1861.*

*On the last Sunday (Sexagesima) in the old fabric the afternoon congregation was an overflowing one, and, after the last words of prayer and praise and blessings had been uttered, the people gathered up the worn bibles and prayer books which had lain there so long, and as they slowly departed the ringers began a "buff peal". I shall never forget the sound or sight. As the old church seem to be knolling its own knell, and the echo of it, as it were, as mysteriously cast back upon us from the upper air, a few persons in small groups lingered mournfully about the churchyard, whilst all the way up the village street the cottagers stood at their doors, their faces shadowed by a solemn, tender pathos, like those who listen to a last farewell of a departing friend, endeared by old and precious associations to their fathers' memories and their own.*

*In taking down the walls we found the fragments of a small Norman window, which belonged apparently to the chancel, but I fear these relics were further smashed by the workmen and buried among the materials for concrete. An ancient female head, which had belonged to a much older building than the last church, had been inserted in the exterior of the north-east wall of the nave, and it replaced, I think, somewhere near its old position in the new church. [Plate 17]. The Sanctus bell-turret, which had stood on the gable of the nave, was, if I remember right, placed among other relics inside the gate of the Parsonage garden; but I should say that it is more than twenty years since I have visited Offenham, and my memory is not very accurate [Plate 18].*

*In digging for foundations we had to open a vault, in which lay the skeletons of two young children, whose death some generations ago we had often read of on the stone that marked their resting place; and the sight of these, or some other skeletons of persons whose names were familiar to us on their tombstones, moved my old parish-clerk to confide to me a week point in his faith, and his wonder how the mouldering frames could ever be restored to life.*

*The enlargement of the church, by a north aisle and vestry, so curtailed our burial ground and more space for interment was deemed necessary, and the strip of glebe between the east end of the chancel and road was purchased for consecration, and the new entrance to the churchyard made therein.....'*



## **The Churchyard and Burial Ground General Appeal - 1969**

After complaints by residents about the state of the churchyard the following letter was circulated –

*At an Open Meeting held in the Reading Room on Wednesday 27<sup>th</sup> February 1969 it was agreed to form a Working Committee and open a Fund to be known as the "Offenham Churchyard Maintenance Fund". An account – unconnected with any Church accounts – would be opened and administered by the Chairman, Secretary and Treasurer.*

*The purpose of this circular letter is threefold:*

*First, it is to advise every household in the village that positive action is being taken to make the old Churchyard and Burial ground a credit to the Village. It was, unfortunately, described in the last "Tidy Village Competition" as "rough". The work party will endeavour to rectify this statement.*

*Secondly, it is to let people know that volunteers are still required to form a working party. In the initial stage, it was intended this working party would meet each Friday night – weather permitting – although there would be no objection to work being done at any other time. As there is, however, so much additional work to be done in the initial clearing-up, many helpers are needed, if only for a short time and for a few hours. This is the case where "many hands make light work". Any work volunteers are asked to give their names to Mr. R. Canning, "Derwent", Main Street, Offenham, tel: Eoesham 3475, who will notify each individual volunteer of the date when work for the season will start.*

*The third item is MONEY. Donations are required so that a special account may be opened for the purchase of special machinery, e.g. a correct type of mower will be needed for regular maintenance. At the Meeting it was agreed that a house-to-house collection be made, this to take place in the two weeks immediately following receipt of this circular. Certain persons have volunteered already to help with the collection, but, at any time of this letter, additional help is still required. Any person willing to assist with the collection, or anyone wishing to make a private donation direct to the Fund, should contact the Hon. Treasurer, Mr. W. Ford, "Emby", New Road, Offenham.*

*We apologise for this rather lengthy circular letter, but we felt that the fullest details must be given on what we consider to be a very worthwhile VILLAGE Appeal.*

*R.A. Canning Chairman, M.M. Ford (Mrs.) Hon. Secretary, W. Ford Hon. Treasurer*

A work party started clearing up the churchyard in March with an article on the clean-up appearing in the Evesham Journal in April of that year. The Rev. J. Bebb, the Vicar of Offenham said;

*"We had a person who came and did some work in the churchyard occasionally but nowadays we cannot afford to employ someone permanently. A work party of 12, with the help of numerous children, began clearing up the churchyard about a month ago. The aim is to level the land, dispose of the debris, and re-seed it. At present a tractor and rotator is being used to level the land, and recently Mr. Canning gave up a week's holiday to work at the churchyard with the help of schoolchildren."*

A second letter circulated in 1970 highlighted the previous year's progress –

**State of Churchyard.** *As can be seen much initial work was carried out, otherwise positive action was taken immediately after last year' letter.*

**Working Party.** *Unfortunately, the response was spasmodic – a few stalwarts carried on until beaten by weather, there was, however, certain weeks – such as the week prior to the sowing of the grass seed – when the turn out of volunteers in so large a number made the whole project seem that much more worth while. There is still a large amount of work to be done on the burial ground site, anyone who can spare any time, even for a few hours, in the Spring or for that matter during the Summer, however short the time, will be more than welcome and volunteers are ask to contact: Mr. R. Canning. A Tree Planting Scheme was drawn up with the Pershore Horticultural Institute and all trees required at present have now been donated and planted.*

Through sheer hard work and determination the churchyard was eventually awarded prizes. The Council for the protection of Rural England's Best Kept Churchyard competition was to award a 'Very Good' certificate in 1977 with 'Excellent' grades in 1983 and 1987. Sadly Reg Canning and a number of the other volunteers are no longer with us but the graveyard continues to be well maintained. Cyril Andrews devoted 12 years to keeping the graveyard tidy but has since retired and maintenance has fallen on the shoulders of Anthony Gittus, Steve Pitt and Derek Robinson. Roy Sollis maintains the flower borders and rockery and Mary and Michael Gazey take care of the church interior.

*The monuments in the churchyard are rapidly deteriorating particularly those in Sections CYA to CYC. Many are splitting apart from the top allowing moisture and frost to penetrate. Most of those shown in Section CYB (above) have more surface damage and loss of inscription while those below in Section CYC are still readable but will easily break apart with the slightest knock.*

## THE SURVEY 2006 - 2010

### **The Burial Registers**

There are a total of six registers, with three for burials only. The first three listed items are held in the Worcestershire Record Office.

**Register 1a.** This is a register of baptisms, marriages and burials and is a paper register, watermarked a flagon, which has been repaired and rebound in Oxford. It was probably commenced in the 1570s, copying out earlier material. Contents: Baptisms, [1538] – 1623, Marriages, [1543] – 1620, Burials, [1538] – 1620. This volume is headed "*Hereafter followe the names of suche p'sonnes that have been christened within the parishe of Offenham since the IX day of Novembre for the XXXth yere of the reigne of our Sovereigne Lord King Henrye the viiith, at which tyme his Graces injunctions were directed unto us. A'o D'm 1538*".

**Register 1b.** Register of baptisms, marriages and burials. This is a parchment register which has also been repaired and rebound at Oxford. This volume was probably commenced in c.1598, copying out the earlier material. Contents: Baptisms, [1538] – 1720, Marriages, [1543] – 1748, Burials, [1538] – 1750.

It is obvious that the due to the uncertain times the incumbent during the period 1643 – 1651 kept his registers hidden to avoid destruction by Cromwell's men as it is written in the baptism register "*In the beginning of the warres this book was either hidden or could not be found and that some children borne during these times. Were not registered therein.*" And against several entries is written "*formerlie forgotten by reasons of the warres.*" There are no marriages or burials recorded during the above period.

**Register 2.** Register of baptisms, marriages and burials. Contents: Baptisms, 1724- 1812, Marriages 1724-1734, 1740, 1749 – 1753, Burials 1724 – 1812.

**Register 3.** Register of burials 1813 – 1923

**Register 4.** Register of burials 1923 – 1997. This volume was closed on 31.12.1997.

**Register 5.** 1998 – Present

It is most unfortunate that only burial registers 4 & 5 give details of where individuals were buried and only on the last seven entries in volume 4.

The earlier Offenham registers have been previously researched and are available on microfiche from the Birmingham & Midland Society for Genealogy and Heraldry. These cover the following periods: Births, 1538 – 1875; Marriages, 1543 – 1899; Burials, 1539 – 1899. A manuscript transcript of the earliest paper registers also was made by J Harvey Bloom in 1895. This volume contains: Baptism, 1538 – 1623; Marriages, 1543 – 1620; Burials, 1538 – 1620. At the end of the volume are sketch pedigrees of the Haslewood and Kenwrick families. This volume is in the Worcester Record Office. Also with the support of the Worcestershire Records Office the Malvern Family History Society are currently transcribing the baptism records for the whole of Worcestershire. This is being split into 3 phases. Phase 1 covers entries from 1813 - 1839. Phase 2 will cover entries from 1754 – 1812 and Phase 3 will cover all entries prior to 1754. Phase 1 is now complete and covers 196 parishes including Offenham.

### **Notes of interest in the Burial Registers 1555 – 1881.**

The following notes, mostly relating to drowning, were extracted from the burial registers covering the periods 1538 – 1812. Later printed registers did not allow space for comments apart from the one entry in 1881 for Jane Holmer who was found drowned. It was interesting to read that Richard Maunder was "himself" when he was buried in 1612 and that Susan Johnson was a "Virgo" when she was buried in 1657. There are 13 recorded deaths due to Smallpox, twelve of these in 1771 and one 25 years later in 1796. I have also added a note from the 1771 baptisms register for Sarah Hudman who died in 1843.

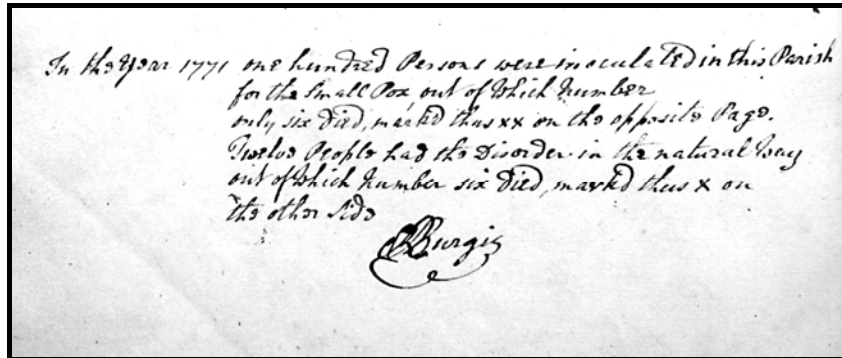

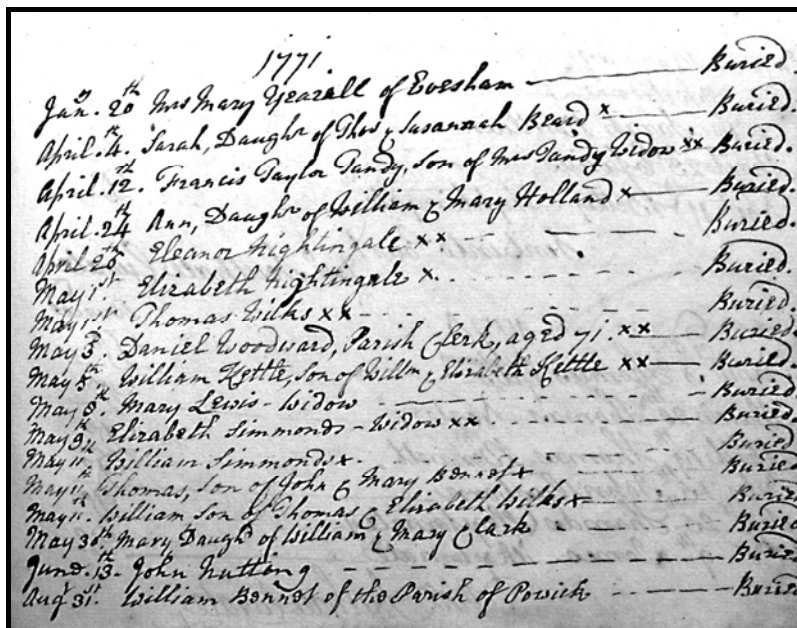

17<sup>th</sup> November 1761. Jane Phillips. Drowned.

April 4<sup>th</sup> to May 11<sup>th</sup> 1771. During this period 12 individuals died from Smallpox. The incumbent, R. Burgis, made the following entry in the register:



**Translation:** "In the year 1771 one hundred Persons were inoculated in this Parish for the Small Pox out of which number only six died, marked thus xx on the opposite page. Twelve People had the Disorder in the natural way out of which number six died, marked thus x on the other side" R. Burgis

### **The top 20 Surnames**

The top 20 surnames, and their variant spellings, in the burial registers are given in Table 1. Also included in the table are the first appearances of the same names in the marriage and baptism registers.

Cox mentions the names of Aldington (from 1572) and Warner (from 1582) being well known Offenham names. The name Aldington first appears in the registers from 1552, where on December 22<sup>nd</sup> Thomas Aldington, the son of John Aldington of Middleton Littleton, married Helen Pulcar. The couple had a total of ten children, all baptised at Offenham, with four of these dying in infancy. The father Thomas dying in 1590. There are only 17 Aldington burials in the registers from 1558 - 1998 and this family accounts for five of them. In addition there are only eight marriage entries involving the Aldington name from 1552 - 1872 and 21 children baptised between 1555 and 1871; these resulting from five couples and a single woman.

The Warner name does first appear from 1582 and is a record of a marriage on April 29<sup>th</sup> of that year between Eleanor Warner of Offenham and Henry Cartwright of Harvington. The only other marriage recorded up until the 1900s is of William Warner to Anne Deakins on January 17<sup>th</sup>, 1724. They had one child who was baptised at Offenham in 1725. This is the only Warner baptism during the period 1538 - 1815 and there are only 15 Warner burials in the registers, one in 1727 and the remainder from 1909 - 2003.

Other well-know Offenham names given by Cox are Spragge (from 1576), Harrys [Harris] (1580), Gibbs (1595), and Moore (1625). My table gives earlier occurrence dates for some of these names. There are 32 Spragg marriages in the registers from 1570 until 1967, only ten of these were males. In fact there has been no male Spragg marriage since 1846 (1570 - 2006).

The oldest known person buried in the churchyard is Alice Harris who was Aged 103. She was born on June 20, 1888 in North Littleton and died a spinster on August 18, 1991. There are three other centenarians buried in the churchyard and 59 persons who were in their nineties. There may be others but unfortunately ages were not generally recorded in the earlier registers, 1538 - 1809, so we do not have ages for 1159 (40%) individuals out of the 2886 people in the Offenham burial database from 1538 to the present day.

The oldest monument in the churchyard will be found in Section CYC and dates from 1680 [Plate 127]. It commemorates the death of Christopher Newington who died in 1679, Aged 11 years, and his mother Mary who died in 1680. She was the mother of eight children of which she saw five buried.

### ***The Monuments, Inscriptions and Notes***

All inscriptions on monuments inside and outside of the church have now been recorded and the monuments photographed. On pages 1 - 116 I have presented the inscriptions in the following format: each line ending is indicated by the forward slash symbol. e.g. In/ Loving Memory/ of/ **William Jones**/ etc. Bold lettering is used for names and square brackets are used to enclose eroded and unreadable parts of the inscriptions. In some cases I have added the missing information after reference to the burial registers. Each inscription is preceded by the plot number, a brief description of the type of monument followed in square bracket by the relevant plate number. On the majority of plates I have presented the inscription as they appear on the monuments, but as some of the monuments shown on the plates are quite readable only plot numbers are shown.

Beneath many of the inscription I have added notes regarding the individuals in the plots. This includes marriage dates and details of family members. Some notes are more detailed than others mainly because the information was readily available in the form of the baptism, marriage and burial registers as well as the census returns; the first census being in 1841. Access to Free BMD and Ancestry.com on the internet was also of considerable help in locating some events, but in these cases only the year of birth, marriage and death was found. Existing family members also provided useful information.

### ***Additional Plates***

Images of the inside of the church are lacking in the published literature therefore I have included a large number of plates showing both the inside and outside of the church. The two Books of Remembrance in the church were also photographed as well as an inscriptions found inside one of the Bibles. One Bible contains a large number of engravings by notable artists and I have included a few of these. Churchyards are havens for wildlife and Offenham churchyard is no exception. As a very keen Ornithologist and Naturist I have also randomly inserted a number of plates showing some of the species of fungi, insects I have recorded during my visits.

### ***The Maps***

When this survey began I found the available maps of the churchyard both confusing and unreliable. For this reason I have produced a new set of maps along with an index to show where individuals are interred. Section OG (old ground) was the most challenging in particular those plots which are unmarked. This large section

contains burials from 1912 - 2010. However for the majority of individuals their last resting place within the church or churchyard will never be known.

### THE WAR MEMORIAL AND BOOK OF REMEMBRANCE

The War Memorial which was erected in 1919 is lying over old burial ground and it was believed that some monuments were removed to accommodate the memorial. However an examination of all the paperwork and correspondence leading up to its erection does not mention the removal of any old stones from this area. The monument itself was supplied by W. H. Gardiner of Evesham at a cost of £175. This money was raised by public subscription which totalled £184.18.0d. Donations ranged from 5d to £7.7.0d. Details of all those commemorated on this memorial are included in this book as well as images of the pages of the Book of Remembrance which is contained in a glass case inside of the church. This beautiful hand produced book was dedicated by the Archdeacon of Dudley and Canon of Worcester A. P. Shepherd D.D. at a Service of Remembrance held in the church on October 10<sup>th</sup>, 1948. Unfortunately there are errors in this book regarding the regiments in which two of the men served.

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## FREDERICK PREEDY 1820 - 1898

The church is mentioned in Barnes (1984) and the leaflet 'Churches on the Preedy Trail, A Tour of this Talented Victorian Architect's Work (1820 - 1899)'. The leaflet is freely available at the Tourist Centre in Evesham. Barnes tells us that Frederick Preedy '*designed 20 new churches, as well as 30 major restorations, 13 new schools, six new chancels, six new naves and 10 other churches where additions were made...*'

Frederick Preedy was born at Offenham on June 2<sup>nd</sup> 1820 and married Mary Morgan in 1858 at Bath. There is a brass wall plaque inside Fladbury church commemorating his birth and death which reads: '*To the Glory of God in loving memory of / **FREDERICK PREEDY** Archt. Sometime of this Parish / Born June 2<sup>nd</sup> 1820, Died March 28<sup>th</sup> 1898 / And of / **MARY PREEDY** / Wife of the above / Born May 16<sup>th</sup> 1831. Died April 22<sup>nd</sup> 1889 / Also of / **ALICE MARY PREEDY** / Their daughter / Born Feb<sup>y</sup> 1<sup>st</sup> 1860 Died Feb<sup>y</sup> 3<sup>rd</sup> 1899 / All of whom were interred at FOXHAM in WILTSHIRE.*' Frederick was one of five children of William Frederick & Eleanor Preedy who were married at Redbourn, Hertford on March 28, 1806. William Frederick Preedy became a member of the Corporation of Evesham, and served as both a Mayor and a Magistrate. He was also the Distributor of Stamps for the County of Worcestershire up until the time of his death. He and his wife are buried in Fladbury churchyard as are

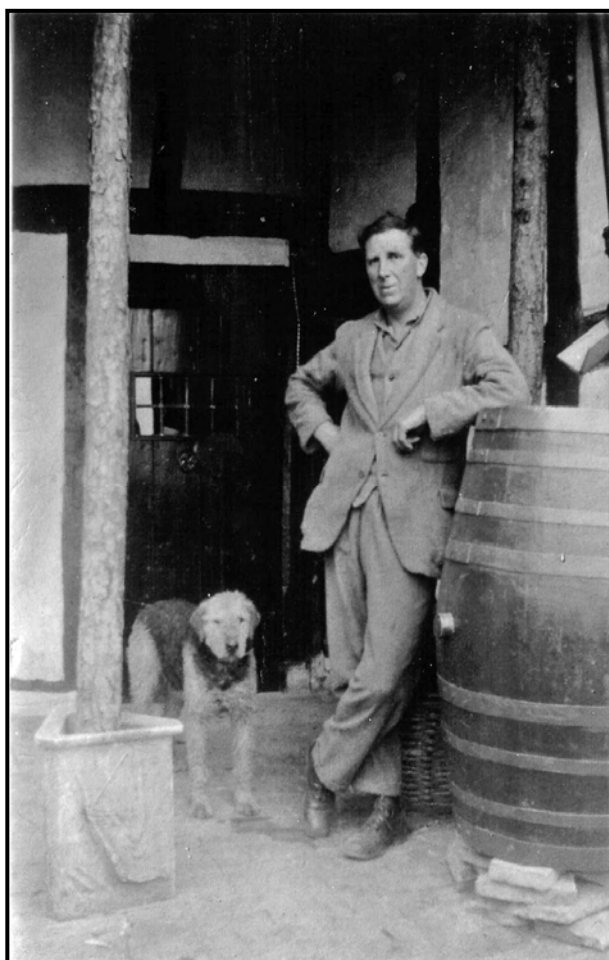


other members of the Preedy family. There are five stained windows dedicated to members of the Preedy family in Fladbury church and one in Offenham church dedicated to Lieutenant Robert Preedy (Plate 29). Robert first joined the 9<sup>th</sup> (East Norfolk) Regiment of Foot as an Ensign and purchased a Lieutenancy in the 59<sup>th</sup> (the 2<sup>nd</sup> Nottinghamshire) Regiment of Foot in 1808. This was published in the Edinburgh Gazette in July 1808. He fought at the Battle of Waterloo as a Senior Lieutenant of his Regiment. He survived that battle and was lucky that he was not aboard the Sea Horse Transport vessel that was wrecked in Tranmore Bay, near Waterford in January 1816, with heavy loss of life to the regiment. Ryland (1824) recorded the event: '*In the month of January, 1816, the Sea Horse transport, having on board the second battalion of the 59th foot, was driven by a raging tempest into this inhospitable bay. It occurred in the day time; the vessel struck and went*

*to pieces, when 292 men, 71 women and children perished in sight of the assembled thousands; only 30 men were preserved. The survivors witnessed their companions and relatives deposited in one vast grave.*' Robert was placed on half pay on March 25, 1816. He died at Hampton, Evesham on November 4, 1834, and was interred either in Offenham church or churchyard on November 14, 1834, but apart from the window there is no other monument. His obituary appeared in the Gentleman's Magazine for January 1835: '*WORCESTER - Nov 5. At Hampton, Aged 52, Robert Preedy, H.P. 59th Foot, youngest son of Wm. Preedy, esq*', and his Waterloo Medal (shown left), which was considered in perfect as issued condition, was sold at Auction on March 2, 2005 for £2100.



## CHARLES COX AND THE OLD MANOR



In an undertaker's ledger which recently came into my possession I found an entry relating to a Charles Cox who was buried in the rear garden of the Old Manor at Offenham in 1944. It was not until 1996 that the body in the garden lead to a debate in the House of Commons (see next page), and the body being exhumed in 1967. Charles was reburied in Bengeworth cemetery, Evesham on February 13, 1967. His wife, Ann, who died in 1972, is also buried with him. Charles and Ann Cox (née Walton) were married in Evesham in 1914, and were the parents of Benjamin G. Cox, author of 'A Short History of the Parish of Offenham' which was published in 1953. Benjamin is the author of many other publications relating to Evesham and its surrounds. He retired to Blandford Forum in Dorset where he became the founding Curator of Blandford Town Museum and is the Emeritus Curator. He has also written numerous publications relating to the history of Blandford and its district. He is now aged 93 and being cared for in a nursing home in Blandford. The Old Manor has had several previous owners including the Gibbs family whose headstones were once dominant in the old part of the churchyard, but since 1928 many of these have disappeared.

## **Oral Answers to Questions — Home Department**

### **House of Commons debates, 17 November 1966**

All Commons debates on 17 Nov 1966

**Sir Gerald Nabarro** (Worcestershire South)

asked the Secretary of State for the Home Department whether he will now announce his decision concerning application of Mr. Granville Gardner, Offenham, near Evesham, Worcestershire, for removal of human remains interred in a shallow garden grave 45 feet from his house, the presence of which was not divulged in the title deeds, the widow of the deceased being elderly and bed-ridden; and whether he will authorise removal to consecrated ground of these human remains, under the Burial Acts.

**Miss Alice Bacon** (Leeds South East)

My right hon. Friend has decided to issue a licence for this purpose.

**Sir Gerald Nabarro** (Worcestershire South)

While thanking the right hon. Lady for bringing this long controversy to a conclusion, may I ask her whether she will now examine the condition of the law in regard to the interment of human remains on private property to ensure a proper interment, that the place of interment is clearly denoted and that when the property changes hands there is an appropriate entry as to the presence of human remains—in this case in a shallow grave—on that private property and that the title deeds note that fact?

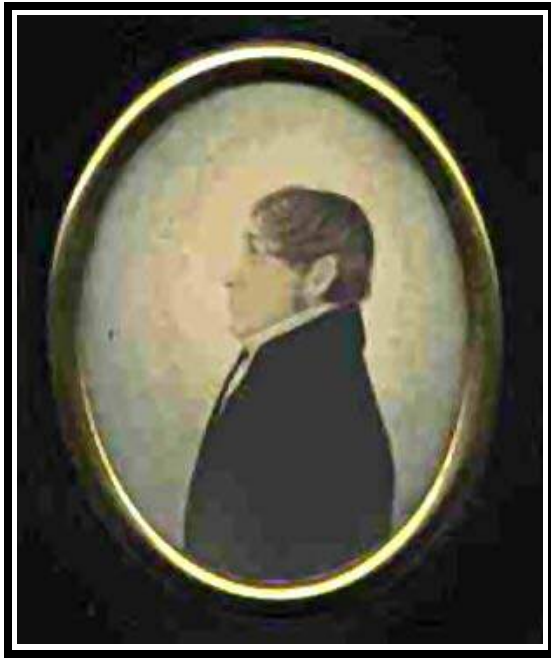
I will certainly look into the matters which the hon. Member has raised, although I could not give any specific assurance about our conclusions. As the hon. Member knows, this has been a particularly difficult case because we have to consider the feelings of the widow who was elderly and the feelings of the people who bought the property and were unaware that the remains of a human body were interred in their garden, but I hope that now a satisfactory conclusion has been reached to this difficulty.



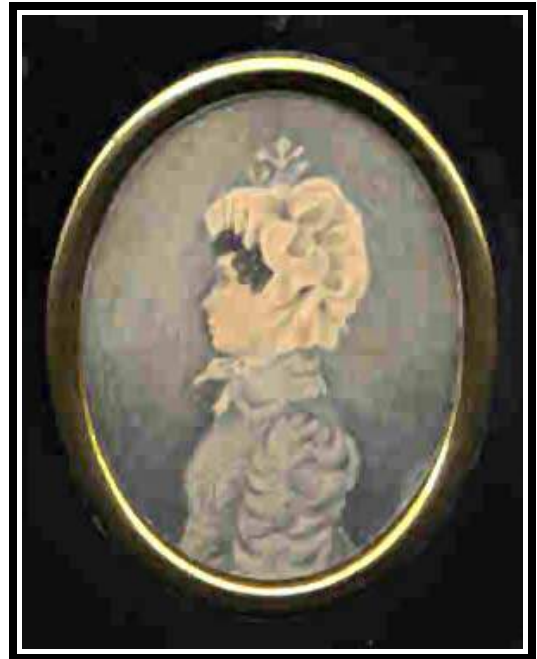

### CYA-1. Tombstone with metal railings. [Plate 81]

IN MEMORY OF ANN BUND/WIDOW OF COLONEL BUND OF WICK EPISCOPI/ SHE DIED 12 NOV. 1862

*Thomas Henry Bund, Colonel in the Worcestershire Militia, married the above Ann, daughter and heiress of the Rev. Pynson Wilmot, Vicar of Halesowen, on November 16, 1802 at St. Michael Bedwardine, Worcester. Wick Episcopi is also known as Upper Wick in historic documents and is in the Parish of Rushwick. Ann was 81 years old when she died.*



### CYA-2. Headstone. [Plate 82]

IN LOVING MEMORY OF/ ELIZABETH/ WIFE OF JOHN CLARKE/ WHO ENTERED INTO REST/ APRIL 27<sup>TH</sup> 1889, AGE 64 YEARS./ ON A STEP REMOVED/ FROM THIS WORLD INTO BLISS/ OUR OWN OUR DEARLY LOVED/ WHOM HERE ON EARTH WE MISS/ ALSO OF/ JOHN CLARKE/ WHO DIED DEC. 11<sup>TH</sup> 1899/ AGED 79 YEARS/ WITH CHRIST, WHICH IS FAR BETTER/ PHIL.1.23.

*John Clarke married Elizabeth Drinkwater on November 30, 1843 at Broadway. John was the son of George & Mary Clarke (née Webb) who were married on March 23, 1819 at Weethly, Warwickshire. They had a further eight children, all born at Offenham: (1) James (b.1822); (2) George (b.1824. He married Elizabeth Johnson at Offenham on October 12, 1845; (3) Henry (b.1828); (4) William (b.1830); (5) Ann (b.1833); (6) Hannah (b.1837); (7) Giles (b.1839); (8) Thomas (b.1842). The father George died in 1867 and his wife Mary in 1882 and both are buried in unknown plots in the churchyard.*



### CYA-3. Cross. [Plate 83]

AND JESUS CALLED/ A LITTLE CHILD UNTO HIM/ IN LOVING MEMORY OF/ SARAH ANN CLARKE/ DIED FEB. 20<sup>TH</sup> 1886/ AGED 12 YEARS./ THIS WORLD OF PAIN AND CARE/ LORD THOSE WOULDST NO LONGER LEAVE HER/ TO THY MEADOWS BRIGHT AND FAIR/ LOVINGLY THOU DOST RECEIVE HER/ CLOTHED IN ROBES OF SPOTLESS WHITE/ NOW SHE DWELLS WITH THEE IN LIGHT.

*Baptised at Offenham on July 13, 1873, Sarah Ann was the daughter of Enos & Sarah Clarke (née Sherwood) who were married at Offenham on June 20, 1870. The wife Sarah died in 1880 but not buried in the churchyard. Enos then married Harriett Wadden at Offenham on March 1, 1888. Enos was a Soldier when he married Harriett but later became a Plasterer by trade. He was residing at Kings Norton during the 1891 census.*

*James Myatt married Sarah Phyllis Martin on December 21, 1828 at St. Giles Church, Camberwell, Surrey. Her headstone is no longer to be found but the inscription was taken from her stone in 1928 and is shown on page 16. James came to Offenham in 1852 from Camberwell where all his children were born. He was born in Leicestershire and not Camberwell as erroneously given in recent publications. James was a subscriber, to the value of £50, for the rebuilding of the church in 1861 and did much to put Offenham on the map in market gardening circles. He occupied Laurels Farm and later the Norvals Farm at Offenham. He, and other members of his family, raised locally many new varieties of potatoes, cabbage, rhubarb, strawberries and other crops. He is better known for his Myatt's British Queen strawberries, which were grown commercially with great success all over the country for over 50 years. His Myatt's early Offenham cabbages are equally or yet more famous. He won prizes at the country's principal shows, and, on account of his improved methods on a field scale, did much to increase the popularity of market gardening in Offenham and the Vale of Evesham generally. In the 1970s the Parish Council were asked to suggest a name for the new development and it was agreed that the man who had such a vast influence on the life of the village deserved to be commemorated – hence Myatt Road. James and Sarah had twelve children: (1) Sarah (b.1831). She married Charles Robert Colston at Offenham on June 10, 1858; (2) James (b.1833); (3) Elizabeth (b.1834). She remained a spinster and buried in an unknown plot on April 8, 1886, Aged 52; (4) William (b.1837); (5) Ann (b.1838). She is in the plot above; (6) Joseph (b.1840); (7) Harriett (b.1843). She married David Smith at Offenham on July 20, 1871; (8) Philip (b.1845); (9) Lucy (b.1846). She married Edmund Andrews at Offenham on September 29, 1874; (10) Mary (b.1848); (11) Frank (b.1849); (12) Charles (b.1853). He married Alice Stephens at Offenham on October 4, 1892.*

It will appear that Charles married again as there was a Martha living as his wife during the 1881 census for Offenham but this third marriage has not been found.*

According to the Baptismal Registers the couple had a total six children; Mary (Bt. 1724 - Dd. 1758, recorded as Mary Hancocks in baptism register), Edward (Bt.1726 - Dd.1726), Edward (Bt. 1736), Sarah (Bt.1738), Joseph (Bt. 1742- Dd.1742) & Anne (Bt. 1743). The husband, Joshua, does not appear in the Burial Registers. Despite extensive searches of the registers a marriage for the couple under Hankinsson or any other spelling of the name was not found, however there is a marriage of a Joshua Hancock to Mary Braggington at All Saints Church, Eoesham on September 18, 1722 which I believe relates to this couple. This Mary is of the right age and was from Pebworth where she was baptised on September 5, 1691, the daughter of Thomas & Joane Braggington (née Ryland) who were married at Pebworth on April 8, 1689.*

#### DEATH OF THE VICAR

The death took place on Saturday morning of the Rev. Charles William Anthony Preston, vicar of Offenham, after a long and painful illness. Mr. Preston who had been vicar of Offenham for twenty years, was taken ill about twelve months ago with a very serious internal malady, and though everything that medical skill and nursing care could do to alleviate his suffering and prolong a valuable life was done, it was evident to his friends that the end was inevitable. He bore his great sufferings with the greatest resignation and fortitude, and though deep regret is felt that a life of so much promise was cut short, this feeling is intermingled with one of thankfulness that the sufferings of one who had interwoven himself into the affections of those among whom he lived are at an end.

The Rev. Charles William Preston, who was 52 years of age, was the son of the late Rev. Charles Moyes Preston (vicar of Warcop, Cumberland), and grandson of the late Mr. Michael Preston, of Warcop Hall. He was educated at Felsted and Christ Church, Oxford, where he took his degree. he was curate of Warcop for some years, and also of Keelby, Lincolnshire, and in 1897 was presented by Christ Church to the living of Offenham, rendered vacant by the death of the Rev. W. J. Bristow. The late vicar very much interested himself in all matters connected with the parish, and during his vicariate the services at the parish church have been brightened. He was a moderately High Churchman of the modern school. Of recent years the schools have been enlarged, and the most public work in connection with the church has been the enlargement of the churchyard. In this connection it is not a little curious that the first burial to take place in the new churchyard is that of the Vicar who did so much to carry out the improvements. In all village matters Mr. Preston was closely identified, and he was in high esteem by his parishioners, who have watched with deep sympathy his failing health. During his long illness he was much assisted in the performance of his clerical duties Mr. J W. Willis Bund, a connection of the family, the Rev. W. C. Allsebrook (vicar of Badsey), and the Rev. F. G.E. Ashworth (vicar of Littleton).

In 1902 Mr. Preston married Miss Mildred Hogarth, daughter of the late Rev. George Hogarth, of Preston-on-Humber, and a cousin of Charles Dickens, who, with two sons, Anthony, aged 14, and David, aged 10, survive him, and with whom deep sympathy is felt.

The flag on the church tower was hung at half mast to indicate to the villagers that he who had worked among them for so long had passed from the sphere of pain and suffering.

A short memorial service was held in the church on Monday evening, and was largely attended by the villagers. It was conducted by the Vicar of Badsey and the Vicar of Littleton.

The funeral took place on Tuesday afternoon and was conducted by the Ven. Archdeacon of Warwick (the Ven. J. F. H. Peile). The lesson was read by the Vicar of Evesham (the Rev. J. M. Walker, D.D., R.D.), and the committal portion by the Rev. W. C. Allsebrook, the concluding prayer being pronounced by the Rev. F. G. E. Ashworth. The surpliced choir was present, and the hymns, "O strength and stay, upholding all creation" and Holy Father cheer out way," were sung, the Organist playing "O rest in the Lord" as the body was borne from the church to its last resting place.

The mourners were Master Anthony Preston (son), Miss A. Alice Hogarth and Miss Mary Hogarth (sisters-in-law), Miss Mabel Cowie (cousin), and Nurse Holtom. Among the clergy present in addition to those

mentioned were the Revs. H. Wilkinson (Cropthorne), J Davenport (Harvington), H. B. S. Fowler (Elmley Castle), J. E. H. Blake (Bretforton), J. P. Shawcross (Bengeworth), D. Fitzmaurice (Hampton), and Edwards (Evesham). The School Managers were represented by Mr. W. T. Careless and Mr. A. Cole, and the churchwardens, Mr. J. H. Smith and W. Smith, were present.

The late Mr. Preston was a strong Freemason, and was a member of the Abbot Lichfield (Evesham) Lodge. This lodge was represented at the funeral by Wor. Bros. H. Maund, I.P.M., a. K. Lindsell, P.M., P.P.G.W., J. Sladden, P.M., P.P.G.D., and J. W.E. Baggitt, P.M., P.G.Sd.B., and Bros. G. E. Crisp, secretary, R. White, G. H. White, R. E. Spires, tyler, and W. Salmon, assistant tyler. The Masons' Oration was read by Wor. Bro. Lindsell, and each brother dropped a sprig of acacia on the coffin. Wor. Bro. W. Gill Smith, master of Abbot Lichfield Lodge, was prevented by being present through absence from home.

Among others in the church were Mr. J. W. Willis Bund, Mr. James Ashwin, Miss Sladden, Mrs. Buckley Bent, Mrs. Geoffrey New, Mr. and Mrs. B. M. Chandler, Mr. B. R. Swift, Mr. A. Nolan Peat, Mr. C. C. Moberly, and a large number of visitors. The school children, accompanied by Mr. and Mrs. Charlton and the teachers, marched in procession from the schools to the church.

Mrs. Preston has received a letter from the Bishop of Worcester, stating that he been at home and [if he] have had sufficient notice, he should have attended and conducted the funeral service.

Flowers have been tastefully arranged round the edge of the grave by the school teachers. A large number of flowers were sent, but in consequence of the restricted rail service a number of wreaths did not arrive in time for the funeral. Among others who sent were: The Vale of Evesham Clerical Society; the Rev. H. W. and Mrs. Wood; "All at Badsey Vicarage"; Mrs. Essex and Family; Mr. and Mrs. A. K. Lindsell; Mr. and Mrs B. M. Chandler; Mr. and Mrs. Geoffrey New; the Misses New; Mr. B. R. Swift; Messrs J. H. and W. Smith (churchwardens); Mr. and Mrs. R. Carlton; the Managers of Offenham Schools; the members of the choir; the teachers of Offenham Schools; the children of the Infant School; Mr. and Mrs. W. L. Courtney; Aunt Rosella, and others.

The funeral arrangements were carried out by Messrs. Fowler and Son, Evesham.

The service tomorrow (Sunday) will be at 5.30 p.m., and will be conducted by the Vicar of Badsey (the Rev. W. C. Allsebrook), and the sermon will be preached by Mr. Willis Bund, who has very kindly offered to come to Offenham for that purpose.

Fifty-one Years Married - Evesham Journal 1929

Thursday was the fifty-first anniversary of the wedding of Mr. and Mrs. Charles Mason, of Offenham, who were married on November 7, 1878 at Offenham parish church by the Rev. W.J. Bristow. Mrs. Mason was formerly Miss Elizabeth Morris, a daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. William Morris, of Offenham, and was 76 years of age on June 1 last. Mr. Mason, who has been a market gardener since 1874, is well known in the district, and was 81 years of age in July. He is a man of fine physique, over six feet in height. Both enjoy fairly good health, Mr. Mason being particularly active. He possesses an extraordinarily good memory, and when interviewed by the "Journal" representative recalled the fact that 51 years ago on Thursday the district experienced the severest frost in history. On that day the Avon commenced to freeze, and continued to do so until the following March, making it possible for carts, etc., to travel on the ice from Stratford to Tewkesbury. Mr. Mason recalled many other interesting happenings of years ago both of national and local interest. During the years 1871 and 1872 he was a member of the Worcestershire County Police, and was stationed at Balsall Heath. The life, however, did not appeal to him, and he resigned. He has travelled a good deal, and in 1870 was employed erecting bridges in Hungary by a London firm. He distinctly remembers the excitement caused by the first train run by the Great Western Railway through Evesham. He retire from work a week ago. Mr. and Mrs. Mason have lived in the same at Offenham for 48 years. They have three daughters, one son, and seven grandchildren. Their many friends in the district will join us in wishing them many more years of continued happiness and good health.

Obituary - Evesham Journal 1935 - The death took place on Boxing Day, at the age of 87, of Mr. Charles Mason, of the Leasowes, Offenham. Mr. Mason, who was a well known and probably the oldest market gardener of the district, had been in ill-health for several months and his well known figure will be greatly missed in the village. For many years he had taken no prominent part in public life, but was quite an authority on local history, and had a remarkable memory of events which had taken place when he was a boy. As a young man he went out to Austria Hungary, just after the Franco-Prussian War, where he had the honour of speaking to, and shaking hands with the Emperor Francis Joseph; and he could tell many interesting stories of his life out there. In politics he was a staunch Conservative. He was the first market gardener in the village who grew wallflowers and other flowers for market and was a noted grower of Marechal Niel roses. On his mother's side he was related to the well-known Worcester family of Sherwoods. Mr. Charles Mason leaves a widow, a son and three daughters. - The funeral took place at Offenham on Monday. The mourners and others present included Mr. W. Mason (son); Miss Mason and Mrs. Weaver (daughters); Mr. T. Weaver (son-in-law); Mrs. Harrison (housekeeper); Mr. H. Marshall (his oldest friend); Mr. J.H. Smith; Mr. W. Smith and Mrs. J. Pritchard (Cleeve Prior). Wreaths were sent by his widow and daughters; Mr. and Mrs. Weaver and family; Mr. and Mrs. W. Mason and family; his

daughter Elizabeth; his grandchildren, John and Lydia; Mr. and Mrs. W. Smith; Mr. and Mrs. A. Price; Mr. H. Marshall; Mr. and Mrs. Trenfield and Mr. Halford; Mrs. Nightingale and Miss Nightingale; Mr. Wilfred Malin (tenant) and several others. - The undertakers were Mr. F. White and Son, Merstowe Green, Evesham.

Harriett was not present in the household or present elsewhere in the village or the UK during the same census. She does not appear in the GRO burial index so her disappearance is a mystery. By the time of the 1881 census unmarried Rose was still housekeeper to John Wormington but had another child Ernest (b.1872). Again the census states that John Wormington was married. He died in 1884 and buried in an unknown plot in the churchyard on September 16, 1884, Aged 57 years. Ten years on and in the 1891 census we find Rose still single but with a further four children, May Beatrice (b.1885), Frederick Horace (b.1886), Elsie (b.1888) and Rose (b.1890). Also in the household was a lodger Frederick Marshall, Aged 29 years and single. Another ten years on we find Rose with her lodger Frederick Marshall and with another child Percy Andrews who was born in 1893. According to their marriage certificates John Wormington was the father of the first three of Rose's children, John, Sarah and Ernest Andrews but the father of the remaining five is unknown. Rose died in 1912 and buried in an unknown plot on August 29, 1912, Aged 64 years. Of her remaining children: Sarah married Richard Freeman at Offenham on September 11, 1888; Ernest is buried in Row C, Plot C-54; Beatrice May married Alvin Maurice Andrews at Offenham on September 18, 1905. They are buried in Hampton cemetery. Beatrice was buried on January 20, 1959, Aged 73 years and Alvin was buried on May 12, 1969, Aged 85 years; Rose married Wilson Thomas Robert Jones at Offenham on September 4, 1909. They are buried in Bengeworth cemetery. Rose was buried on March 13, 1940, Aged 49 years and Wilson was buried on April 1, 1957, Aged 68 years; Elsie married John Ballard at Offenham on November 11, 1908. **INTERESTING OFFENHAM ANNIVERSARY - MR. AND MRS. R. HARRIS MARRIED SIXTY YEARS.**

Much interest was centred locally in the diamond wedding of Mr. and Mrs. Ralph Harris, a popular Offenham couple, which took place on Monday. They were married at Offenham Parish Church on April 29, 1880, by the Rev. W. J. Bristow. They celebrated the occasion by a gathering of their family, when a cake, with sixty candles, was cut. The many telegrams of congratulations they received included one from the King and Queen and one from Mr. Rupert De la Bere, M.P., the latter sent from the House of Commons. Throughout the day neighbours and other friends called in to congratulate Mr. and Mrs. Harris. Mr. Harris was 24 and his bride 20 when they were married. The first ten years of their marriage life was spent at the Fish and Anchor Inn, North Littleton, of which Mr. Harris was the licensee. Subsequently they moved to "The Shop" Offenham, where Mr. Harris took over his father's business as a general store keeper. For the last 17 years Mr. and Mrs. Harris have resided at "Milburgh House" Offenham, while the shop is now run by their son, Mr. Ralph Harris, junr.

Mr. Harris has had an eventful life, He started work at an early age, assisting his father, the late Mr. Charles Harris, in the transport of market garden produce from Offenham to Birmingham. They used to travel overnight with their horse and cart, arriving at Smithfield Market at 5.30 a.m., when they would wait for the gates to open. At the age of 18 Mr. Harris went to sea. he started as a steward on the steamship "St. George" (1,235 tons), sailing from Liverpool to Calcutta. He did another voyage on the same boat to Alexandria, then transferred to the "Dhoolia" travelling from Hull to Calcutta. he subsequently served on the "Pekin" a P. and O. boat and the "Scawfell," a 818-ton sailing vessel. Most of his voyages were in Indian waters, but he twice rounded the Cape in the "Scawfell." While on the "Pekin," Mr. Harris saw the Royal yacht "Osborne" pass in the Suez Canal, taking the Prince of Wales (subsequently King Edward VII) on his first trip to India. At Bombay the "Peking" was one of six P. and O. ships to fire a salute for the Royal yacht. Among his many seafaring experiences, Mr. Harris relates how he used to assist other members of the crew in catching sharks with a hook and line, using a piece of salt pork as bait. His constant companion at one time was a mongoose, which he still possesses, although it is now stuffed and mounted. Mrs. Harris was Miss Ann Elizabeth Bryan, of Aston Manor, Birmingham, before her marriage. She takes a keen interest in social affairs in Offenham, and is a familiar figure at local whist drives. In her younger days she was a staunch member of the Conservative Party and did much work for the Primrose League. There are three sons and five daughters living. Messrs. Ralph and Rupert Harris, Mrs V. R. Morris, Mrs Stobart Smith and Mrs. Bert Aldington live locally, while Mr. Charles Harris is in Canada and Miss Alice Harris and Mrs. Annie Spiers reside in Evesham. There are 15 grandchildren.

MR. J. E. SMITH - AN APPRECIATION - Jack Smith was an outstanding personality. Born and bred in the village, he was known and respected by all Offenham people. He had an inexhaustible fund of local knowledge, and from his wide range of reading, he was something of a local historian. His first love was his Church, to which he devoted freely, so much of his time and energy over many years, occupying the highest place permitted to a layman, for he was Vicar's Warden and Treasurer for upwards of 40 years. His interests did not end there, for he was deeply involved with the social life of the village, the Royal British Legion Club, the Offenham Cricket Club, of which he was the official scorer for many years. He was also interested in the Football Club, and for many years was a Manager/Governor of the Village School. He was also called upon to audit the accounts of several village organisations. In the address at this funeral, Canon Bartlett, a former Vicar of Offenham said- There was hardly anything connected with the village that Jack Smith was not involved in, in some way. One might put it in the way - "Offenham meant Jack Smith, and Jack Smith meant Offenham".

All sorts of people turned to Jack Smith for advice, and they never went away empty handed. He was Clerk to the Parish Council for many years, so he embraced the whole of the community. His place will be difficult to fill. He will be sadly missed by many. I remember just before I became Vicar of Offenham, someone who knew Jack Smith, saying

to me "You will Jack Smith a tower of strength." I found that to be so!. I always looked upon him as a typical English gentleman. May he rest in peace. W. A. Bates.

At the time of his death Evesham Hospital only had a room for cancer patients and wanted to build a unit. Alan asked Shirley if she would do something and so in response to Alan's request and Evesham's need for a Macmillan Unit the Offenham Handicraft Group, of which Shirley was a founder member set about raising funds. Over the years they raised over £11000. Apart from the craft group, Shirley got involved in many aspects of village life - Tuesday coffee morning, Maypole Club, WI and for a while the Wake. Shirley loved to cruise and when she was diagnosed with Cancer eleven years ago she went with Ray Wood, the widowed man next door, on a number of lovely cruises. She was a wonderful travelling companion and they shared many happy memories of various adventures they took part in. However when it came to time Shirley was set in her ways particularly her mealtime routine - Breakfast 8 am, morning coffee 10.30 am, lunch 12 noon, tea 5 pm and evening drink 9.00 pm. Afternoon tea was a little flexible but still had to be taken. Whenever she was out she had to stop for coffee as near to 10.30 am as possible. Shirley loved animals and always had cats. Her latest dog, Robbie, who she adored is now living with the Harrison family in Offenham. She also loved flower, gardens and gardening centres. She had an inner-strength which was an amazing inspiration to all those who have known her through Alan's death and her own fight against cancer. She loved to have her family - her four children, three daughters in law, eight grandchildren plus Ray, and his daughter Natalie around her. She was the hub of the wheel, the pivotal point of the family. Shirley bravely fought a long illness and she is now at peace.

Reg Canning of Offenham died in May after a short but debilitating illness. He was the Ringing Master at St Mary & Milburgh Church for much of the 24 years he rang the bells.

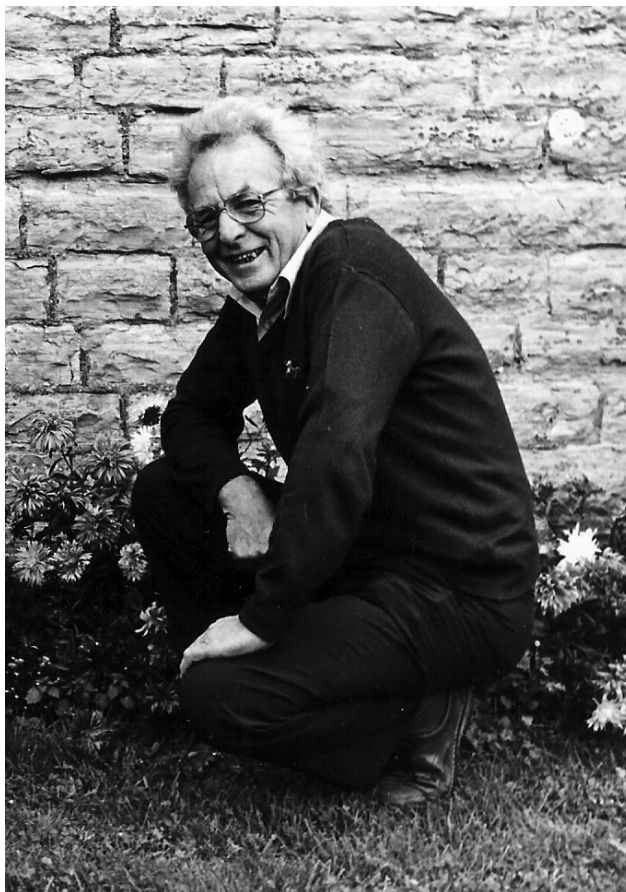
Reg was very much an Offenham man, He was born at 'Derwent' in Main Street and he lived there for all but five years of his life. He subsequently died in that same building. Reg could easily have been called 'Mr Offenham', because he had a deep commitment to the village and he showed this in a number of things he did, and the number of positions he held in it. It was the church in particular he held in high esteem, being Churchwarden, ringer and clockwinder, and some years ago, when the churchyard was something of a jungle, he raised money to tidy it up. Then he headed the working party to undertake the work. It was tidied up so well and over a long period that Offenham churchyard eventually won 'The Best Kept Churchyard' certificate in 1987, an achievement of which Reg was very proud.

As a young man, Reg volunteered for and was accepted into the Royal Air Force in 1941 at the age of 18. He spent a period in the Crash Crew before being posted to India and Burma. He was demobbed in 1946.

There was no doubt some difficulty in finding work after being demobbed, as many were trying. Offenham's opportunities would have been limited to 'the ground'. However, Reg managed to find employment with the Prudential Insurance Company in 1947 and he stayed with them until 1984. He was the Vale's 'Man from the Pru'.

In 1948, he married Pearl and a very happy marriage ensued. Reg used to joke that he was 'The man from the Pru, married to Pearl, making it a Friendly and Commercial Union!' They had two sons, Roderick and Eric, who both live in the village with their families. Reg and Pearl completed their 49 year of marriage a few days before Reg passed away.

With such interest in the Church, it was natural that Reg should take an interest in its then-silent bells. This was back in 1973. Reg's persuasiveness encouraged some teenagers, including Eric, into the ringing chamber, where tuition was given. It was not long before Reg himself became interested in the Art and subsequently learnt to ring. Reg and Eric joined the newly-formed Four Shires Guild in its first year of operation, 1974, and they have been members ever since. With the help from Tony Brazier and Ray Selby of Cleeve Prior, the Offenham band became quite proficient and was soon taking part in a number of FSG striking competitions. Reg was very proud of his band. Unfortunately, poor eyesight prevented Reg moving into change ringing and he thus confined himself to ringing the tenor behind.



Visitors to Offenham ringing chamber must enter through a beautifully crafted wooden door and arched door frame. It is an excellent piece of work. A little plaque to the left of it fixed to the wall records that Reg gave this door assembly in memory of his next-door neighbour, a Miss Moss, and to celebrate his and Pearl's 40<sup>th</sup> wedding anniversary.

More recently, Reg busied himself with ensuring that his beloved bells were in fine fettle. An inspection revealed worn clapper bushes, pulley wheels and a main bearing, so it was not long before work was underway. Money from a bell fund set up by Reg covered part of this, but to complete the work, Reg gave the remainder from his own pocket. A letter of thanks from the PCC luckily arrived a month before his death.

Reg was a kindly man, calm and easy-going, who could make things happen when he wished to. He enjoyed people's company and was fond of telling a yarn or a good joke, sometimes quite a few at a time. There was always a twinkle in his eye when the joke was mildly earthy (never ever more than that), and they were told in a way that only a graduate of the University of Life can tell them, such that one could never be offended; and normally the conclusion was accompanied by a roar of laughter from the recipient. Although Reg would never have regarded himself as a ringing expert, his contribution to ringing rose above mastering the technicalities by ensuring 'his' bells were rung virtually every Sunday morning, and he obtained ringers from near and far to achieve this if it was necessary.

His funeral took place in the Church he knew and loved so well and he came to rest in the churchyard he had taken so much care of, just about in-line with the maximum noise from the western louvers of the tower. The bells were rung half-muffled at the Service and a half-muffled quarter-peal was rung in the evening. There must be fewer and fewer people able to spend their lives in and devote their lives to the locality in which they were born. Reg Canning managed it and he seemed a very happy person who was very much at peace with himself for doing just that. May he continue in happiness and peace.

Bert Jones was born in Evesham on the 20<sup>th</sup> February 1922 and he attended Swan Lane Council School. When he was a teenager his parents moved to Worcester where they ran the Albion Pub. In 1940 Bert joined the RAF and on his first day he went into the Pub and met Ada who was working for his parents. Ada fell in love with the handsome young man in his RAF uniform and Bert fell in love with his darling Ada. However it was wartime and Bert went off to do his bit for his country. He served as an air gunner, firstly with coastal command and then with bomber command. With the RAF he went all over the place including Iceland, France, Belgium, Holland, Germany, Singapore and Malaya.

Meanwhile his beloved Ada waited patiently back home and on the 3<sup>rd</sup> November 1947 they got married.

Bert was a very keen footballer and he played for various RAF teams all over the world. When he was demobbed in 1946, and returned to Worcester, he had a short spell playing with Worcester City before the family, including Bert and Ada, moved to Cheltenham. Bert and Ada worked with his parents in the licensing trade, at The Crown in the High Street. After a short spell playing football for Cheltenham Town Bert joined a couple of local football teams for whom he played for a period of twenty nine years.

Bert eventually left the licensed trade and went back to work for Cheltenham Borough Council. He started as a rent collector and moved onto being a clerk in the offices before retiring in 1982 with ill health, after 12 years with council. Bert and Ada moved back to Evesham in 1976 and when he retired they moved to Offenham where they both became active members of the British Legion, Bert was a committee member from 1984 - 1992 and he would frequently help out behind the bar.

Perhaps within Offenham, Bert is best known for the thirty years spend organising the Offenham residents coach trips. In the early days the annual coach trip went to Weymouth but gradually moved onto other places such as the Isle of Wight, Torquay, Paignton and Newquay to name but a few. There was always a waiting list for these very popular, well run holidays. It was only two years ago that Bert organised his last trip to the Isle of Wight when his deteriorating health meant he had to give up, along with Ada not being so well either. Bert died of heart failure at Worcester Hospital on 27<sup>th</sup> November 2009.

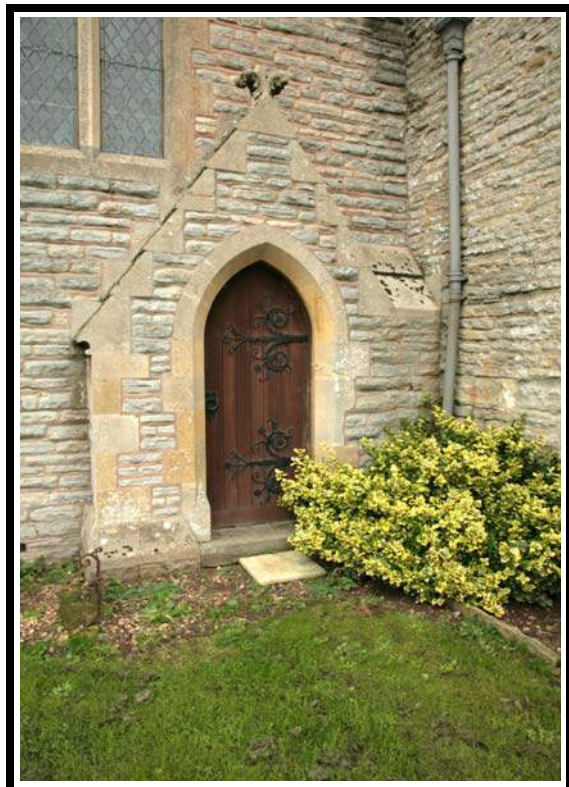
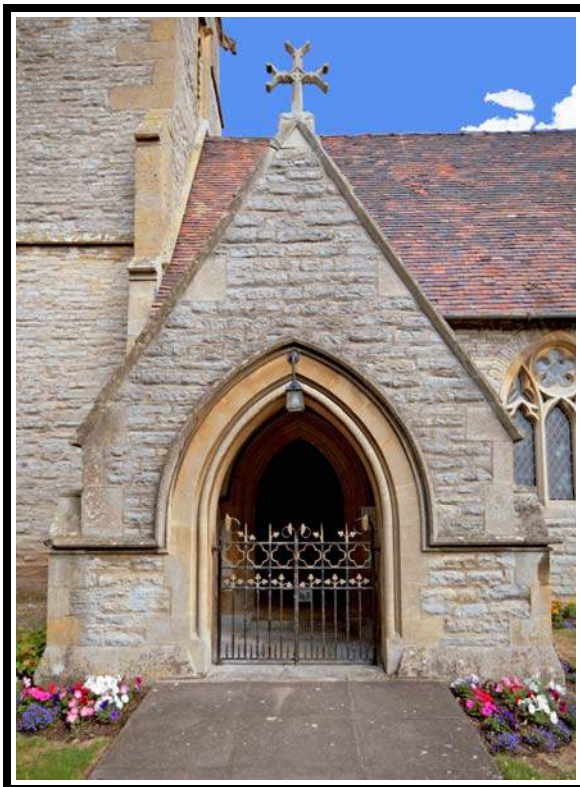
This undated early photograph hangs in the vestry and was presented to Offenhams Church in 1945 by the daughter of the former Vicar of the Parish, William James Bristow. He was Vicar of Offenhams for 33 years. He died in 1897, aged 63, and was buried in the churchyard in Section CYB. Only one of the four crosses shown to the left of the photograph still exists, the furthest right, and is dedicated to Alice Ann Pashler who died in 1895.





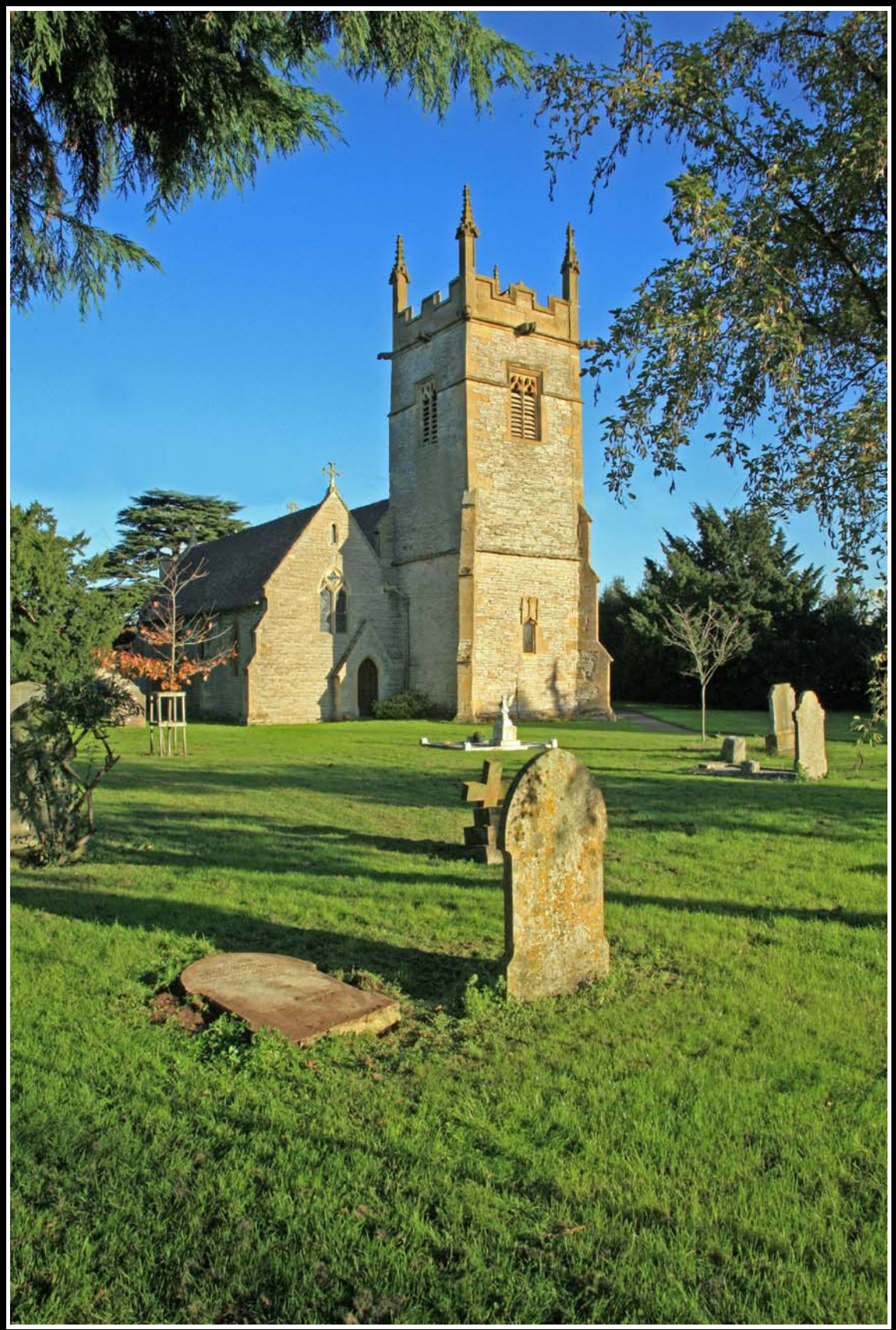

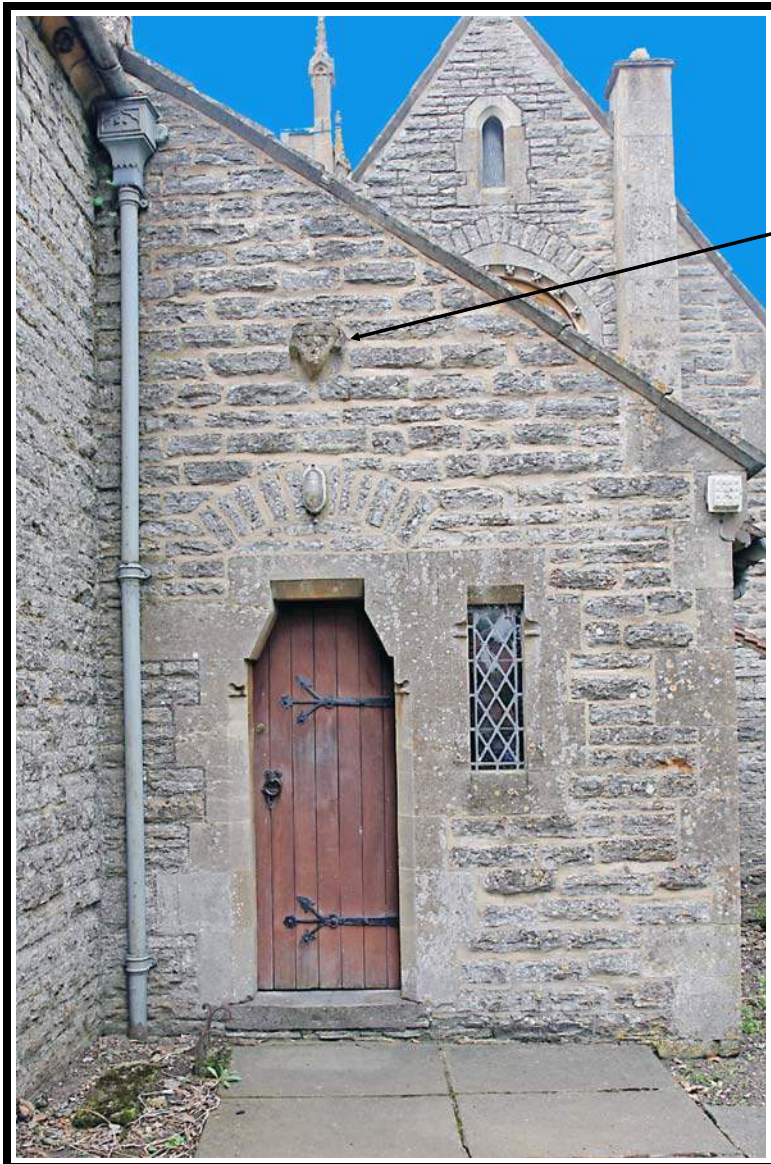






*The ancient yew tree dominating the entrance to the churchyard. There has been a long association of yew trees in churchyards and there are many hundreds of churchyards in England which contain yew trees which are older than the building itself. It is not known why there is this link but there are many theories- from yews being planted over the graves of plague victims to protect and purify the dead; to the more mundane in that yews could be planted in churchyards as it was one of the only places that cattle did not have access and therefore would not be poisoned by eating the leaves. Yew trees are taken as symbols of immortality in many traditions, but are also seen as omens of doom. For many centuries it was the custom for yew branches to be carried on Palm Sunday and at funerals.*

*This monument is mounted on the wall of the vestry. Edward married Anne Emes at Offenham on May 11, 1693. They had four sons, all baptised at Offenham: Edward on April 10, 1694, Robert on July 30, 1695, Raphael on April 6, 1703 and William on May 19, 1707, but he died in 1708 and buried on December 2, 1708. Of the four sons - Edward, who became Rector of Atherstone on Stour, married Mary Field at Offenham on December 26, 1721, and Raphael married Caecilia Freeman at Weston Subedge on March 7, 1732. They had four children, all baptised at Offenham: Ciscilia on February 22, 1738, Thomas on January 16, 1740, Anne on November 18, 1742, and died a month later, and another Anne was baptised on February 6, 1745.*

*Edward was born at Kings Sutton in 1663, the son of Robert & Elizabeth Kenwick (nee Townshend). Robert owned the Manor of Kings Sutton from 1598. In 1488 King Henry VII granted the Kings Sutton Manor to George, the In 1488 King Henry VII granted the Kings Sutton Manor to George, the son and heir of Thomas, 1st Earl of Derby. Over the following hundred years it passed through the Derby family until in 1597, during the reign of Queen Elizabeth 1, the Manor was sold by William, 6th Earl of Derby to James and Robert Kenwick for the sum of eight hundred and twenty pounds; the Hundred remaining in the hands of the Derby family. James Kenwick had been the 5th Earl of Derby's bailiff for the Hundred of King's Sutton. A year later in 1598 James Kenwick renounced his share to his nephew Robert and retired to the family home in Eccleston, Lancashire. The Manor then continued through Robert Kenwick's descendants until 1735 when George Kenwick sold the Manor to the Attorney General, Sir John Willes. Sir John Willes was made attorney general in 1733. In 1739 he was made Chief Justice of the Common Pleas, a position he held for twenty-one years.*

*The name "Kenwick" has now almost completely died out. References to the family often recorded the name as "Kenrick" or "Kendrick", though they were very insistant on "Kenwick".*

*This ledger, which is located in the vestry, commemorates the burials of three of the children of **John & Leonora Wheler**. The children, **John & William**, are recorded in the burial registers under **Wheeler** and **Elizabeth** under **Wheler**. **John** was buried December 3, 1756 and **William** March 6, 1758. Both were only 8 years of age. **John & Leonora** (nee **Colesher**) were married on October 23, 1743 at Hindlip, Worcester. In addition to those mentioned above they had a further two children at Offenham; **Leonora**, born July 10, 1745 and **Richard** who was born in 1753. All but **Elizabeth** are recorded in the baptism registers and under the name of **Wheeler**. **John** senior died in 1781 and buried in an unknown location either inside the church or in the churchyard on July 29, 1781. His wife **Leonora** is not recorded in the burial registers.*



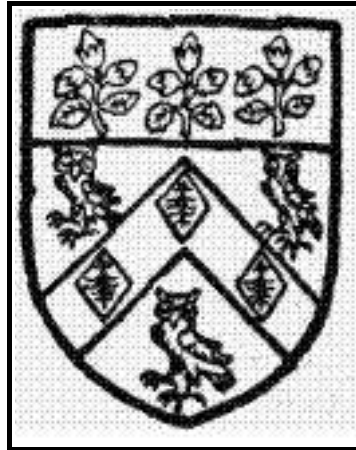

*This well worn ledger with a Latin inscription, roughly translated above, is located on the floor alongside the organ and covered over with carpet. Francis was buried on August 22, 1665. He was at one time Lord of the Manor of <sup>(1)</sup>Wick Warren, where he was born in 1607, and also Sheriff of Worcestershire. He married Sarah Andrewes on October 11, 1649 at Welford-on-Avon. They had two children, a daughter Sarah who was baptised at Offenham on March 16, 1650 and a son Thomas was also baptised at Offenham on December 17, 1652. Thomas married Margaret Dowdeswell on May 1, 1682 at Bushley, Worcester and in turn had ten children; the one son Thomas who was born in 1683 was buried in the churchyard on January 10, 1732. There was at one time a large table-top tomb near the present porch of the church in memory of Thomas but no full inscription from that monument exists. He had a son James, who died in 1750 and buried in the churchyard on September 10, 1750, aged 25.*

*The father of Francis was Thomas Haslewood who married Elizabeth Dingley on April 15, 1600 at Crophorne. He died in 1624 and his tomb is in Pershore Abbey. There are a total of eight burials of Haslewoods in the Offenham churchyard from 1604 to 1857. Published literature tells us that Offenham was founded as a monastic grange and medieval deer park by the Benedictine Abbots of Evesham Abbey in the 13th century, the old grange stood where Court Farm now stands. The grange was established to enclose the large flocks of sheep needed by the Abbots to trade wool with Flanders. During the Dissolution of the Monasteries the grange became crown property and Henry VIII granted both Offenham and Evesham to Philip Hoby, one of his English Ambassadors. The grange and park later became the property of the Hazelwood family until the mid-18th century when it was sub-divided; by this time the village had formed an adequate farming and market gardening community.*

<sup>(1)</sup>*The manor of WICK NEAR PERSHORE, or WICK WARREN, was given by Thomas Earl of Warwick to John de Atherston and the rent from it was granted in 1397 to John Russell. The Russells continued to make conveyances of the manor until 1401–2, but it had probably been restored to Thomas Earl of Warwick with Wick Piddle, his son Richard holding courts there in 1414 and 1420. This manor seems to have been held by John Shipston for life, for about 1430 Richard Earl of Warwick granted the reversion after his death to John Vampage and his wife Elizabeth. John was succeeded in 1452 by a son William, who sold the manor and household goods in 1475 to Thomas Brugge. Vampage, however, recovered the manor before 1480 on payment of a sum of money to Jane widow of Thomas Brugge. William Vampage was knighted in 1487 and sold the manor before 1492 to Giles Greville. Giles, who was afterwards knighted, was succeeded in 1528 by a daughter Elizabeth, who married firstly Richard Wye, and secondly William Nevill, second son of Richard Lord Latimer. William Nevill, who was a poet of some note, involved himself in considerable difficulties owing to his dealings with one Richard Jones, an astrologer, who induced him to believe that he would one day become Earl of Warwick. On the strength of this prophecy he built a new gallery at Wick 'that he might keep there 100 or 200 men, with drawdoors and other privy doors to convey them at his pleasure'. In 1530 Wick was settled on William and Elizabeth and William's heirs. Richard Nevill, who was perhaps the son of William*

and Elizabeth, sold the manor to Edward Haselwood in 1545, and in the following year Giles Wye, son of Elizabeth by her first husband, confirmed this sale. Fulk Haselwood, who succeeded his father Edward in 1558, bought Wick Burnell in 1590–1, and the two manors have since followed the same descent. He died about 1597, and his son Thomas had livery of the manor in 1606. Thomas, his wife Elizabeth and his son Francis were brought before the Council in 1622 as rebels, they having resisted apprehension by the serjeant-at-arms. Thomas was succeeded in 1624 by Francis, who was fined in 1630–2 for not taking knighthood. He complained in 1651 that, though he had always adhered to Parliament, he had been accused of going to Worcester and sending there a horse and provisions while it was the king's garrison and of going with the king's forces to Evesham, and that his estate had therefore been sequestered. He was Sheriff of Worcestershire in 1663, and had been succeeded before 1675 by his son Thomas Haselwood, who was knighted in 1681 and acted as Sheriff of Worcestershire in the following year.





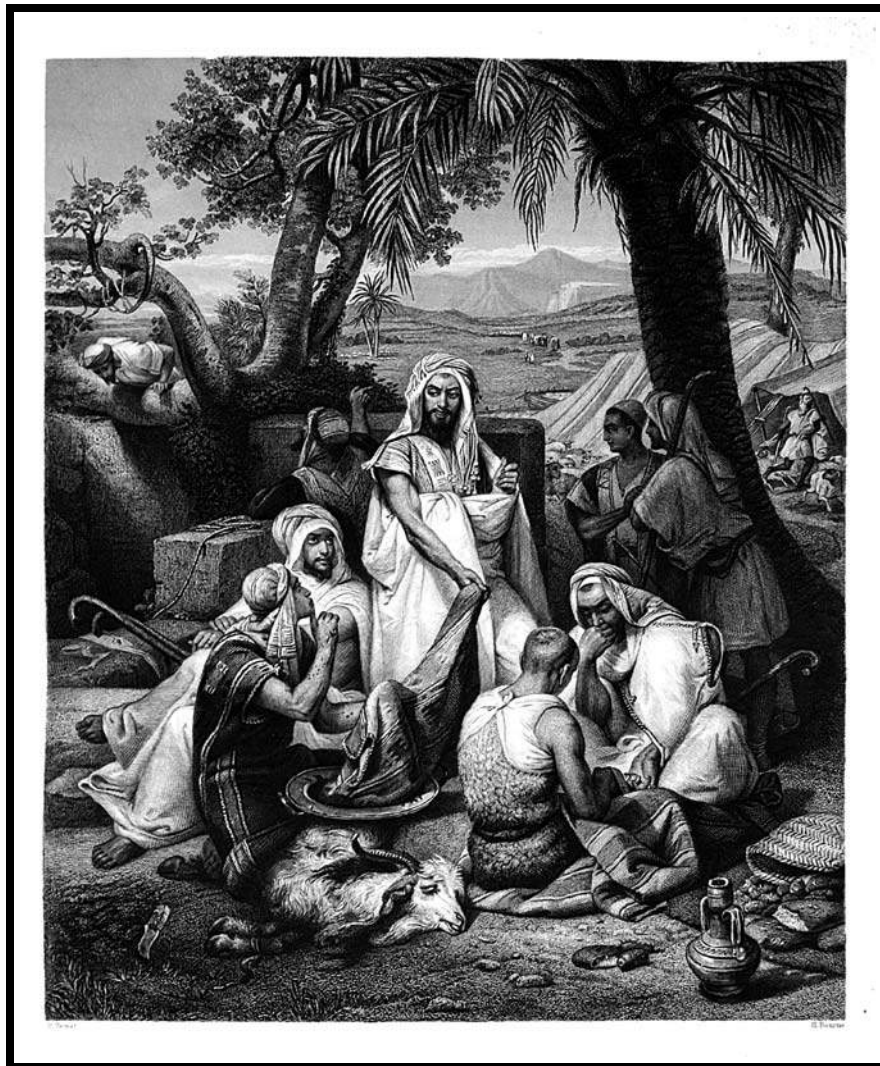

**Obituary - Evesham Journal & Four Shires Advertiser – Saturday April 8, 1922.**

Offenham – Military Funeral. – The remains of the late Sergt. John Ballard were laid to rest in the Parish Churchyard on Monday. The deceased was the second son of the late William and Mrs. Ballard of Fern Cottage, North Littleton. He married a Miss Elsie Andrews of Offenham, and lately resided at 15, Council Houses. Deceased was an old soldier, having enlisted in the 1<sup>st</sup> Worcestershire Regiment in 1901. He left the service in 1906, but on the outbreak of war rejoined the Colours. He was wounded in January 1915, and was afterwards discharged through wounds received in May 1915. He was the first soldier to visit Evesham Hospital to have his wounds dressed. He has been a great sufferer ever since his discharge. He passed away at Evesham Hospital on March 30, after having patiently borne his long and painful illness. On April 3 he was buried with full military honours. The service was conducted by the Vicar (the Rev. G. H. B. Greening). The coffin was which was covered with the Union Jack, bore the inscription: “John Ballard, died March 30<sup>th</sup>, age 39. Gone is the one we loved so dear, To his eternal rest; Gone to heaven, we have no fear, To be for ever blessed” The bearers were six ex-Service men, Messrs. G. Clack, G. Spiers, W. Rouse, W. Bowen, Nightingale and Marshall. The mourners were Mrs. Ballard (widow), Master Percy Ballard (son), Messrs. Wilson Ballard, Eli Ballard, George Ballard (brothers), Mrs. V. Rees, Mrs G. Gough (sisters), Mrs. Gisbourne (aunt), Mrs. H. Andrews and Mrs. P. Andrews (sisters-in-law), Messrs. V. Rees, A. Summers, H. Andrews, P. Andrews, and A. Andrews (brothers-in-law), Mrs. Anderson (Birmingham) and several members of the Offenham Branch of the British Legion. A firing party with bugler attended from Norton Barracks. Much sympathy is felt for the widow and the two little boys for whom the past seventeen weeks have been very trying and anxious. Some beautiful wreaths were sent by the following: - “The Widow, Children and Father-in-law”; “Mother and Brothers” ; “Brother Wilson and Family” ; Mrs. Gisbourne (Littleton); Mr. and Mrs. H. Andrews; Mr. and Mrs. Alvin Andrews (Hampton); Mr. and Mrs. V. Rees (Littleton); Mr. and Mrs Summers (Evesham); Mr. and Mrs. G. Gough (Evesham); Mr. and Mrs. Carter; Mr. and Mrs. P. Andrews (Birmingham); Mr. and Mrs. Beasley (Evesham); Mr. and Mrs. Nightingale and family; Mr Thornton and family; The Offenham Branch British Legion.

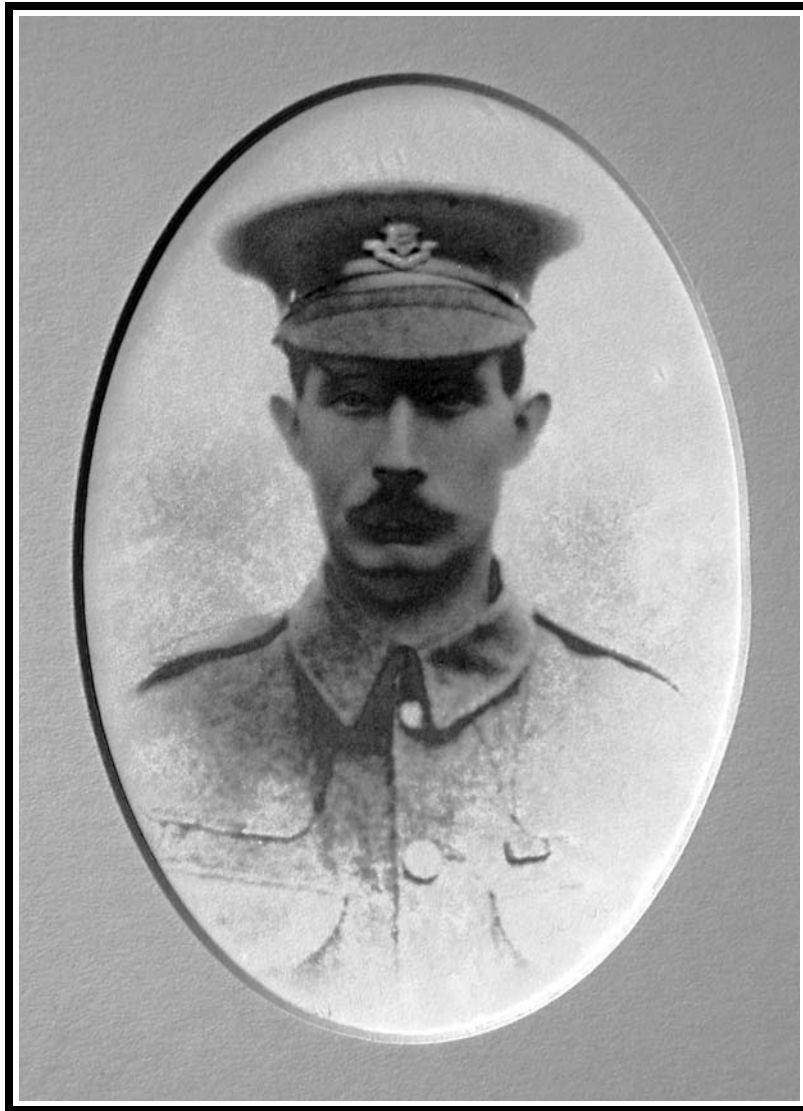
*John Ballard was medically discharged from the Army on May 6th, 1915. His injuries were listed as (1) gunshot wound left thumb, (2) fracture of the phalanges, (3) deafness without perforation. His thumb was actually amputated. It is interesting to note that he is referred to as a Sergeant in the above obituary. This was a rank he held at the end of his previous service in the Worcestershire Regiment and as a Special Reservist. He was given the rank of Corporal. on re-enlistment in 1914. He was buried in Section OG, Plot A-16. There is no monument on this plot.*

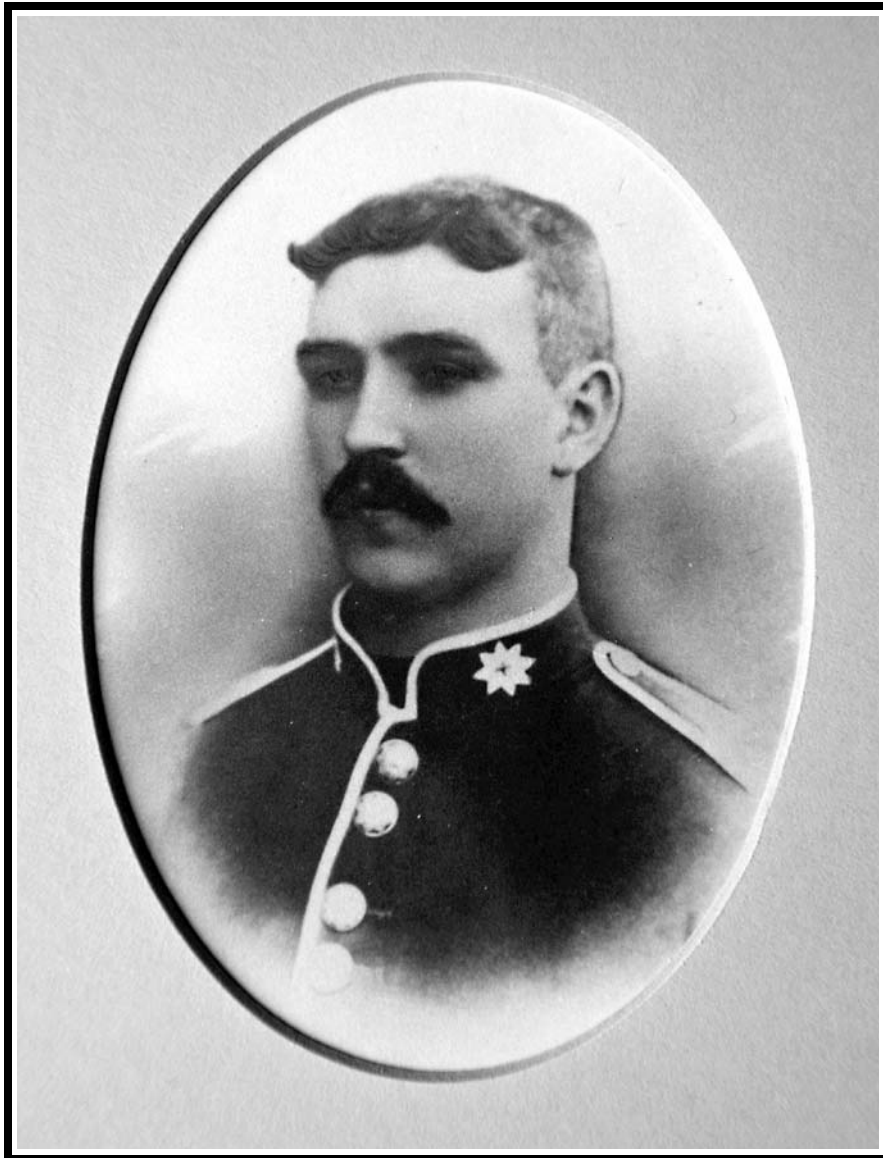
*Colincamps and "Euston", a road junction a little east of the village, were within the Allied lines before the Somme offensive of July 1916. The cemetery was started as a front line burial ground during and after the unsuccessful attack on Serre on 1 July, but after the German withdrawal to the Hindenburg Line in March 1917 it was scarcely used. It was briefly in German hands towards the end of March 1918, when it marked the limit of the German advance, but the line was held and pushed forward by the New Zealand Division allowing the cemetery to be used again for burials in April and May 1918. The cemetery is particularly associated with three dates and engagements; the attack on Serre on 1 July 1916; the capture of Beaumont-Hamel on 13 November 1916; and the German attack on the 3rd New Zealand (Rifle) Brigade trenches before Colincamps on 5 April 1918. The whole of Plot I, except five graves in the last row, represents the original cemetery of 501 graves. After the Armistice, more than 750 graves were brought in from small cemeteries in the neighbouring communes and the battlefields. The cemetery now contains 1,293 Commonwealth burials and commemorations of the First World War. 170 of the burials are unidentified but there are special memorials to 32 casualties known or believed to be buried among them, and to two soldiers whose graves in nearby small cemeteries were destroyed in later battles. The cemetery was designed by Sir Reginald Blomfield.*

*Rancourt was captured by the French on 24 September 1916, and remained in Allied hands until 24 March 1918 and the German advance. It was recaptured by the 47th (London) Division on 1 September 1918. The cemetery was begun by units of the Guards Division in the winter of 1916-17, and used again by the burial officers of the 12th and 18th Divisions in September 1918. After the Armistice, six graves from the surrounding battlefields were brought into Row E. Rancourt Military Cemetery contains 93 burials and commemorations of the First World War. 20 of the burials are unidentified but there is a special memorial to one casualty known to be buried among them. There are also three Second World War burials in the cemetery, all unidentified. The cemetery was designed by N A Rew.*

*The La Ferte-sous-Jouarre Memorial commemorates nearly 4,000 officers and men of the British Expeditionary Force who died in August, September and the early part of October 1914 and who have no known grave. The monument consists of a rectangular block of stone, 62 feet by 30 feet and 24 feet high, with the names of the dead engraved on stone panels on all sides of the monument. The monument is surmounted by a sarcophagus and a trophy carved in stone. At the four corners of the pavement are stone piers with urns, carved with the coats of arms of the Empire. The memorial was designed by G.H. Goldsmith and unveiled by Sir William Pulteney on 4 November 1928.*

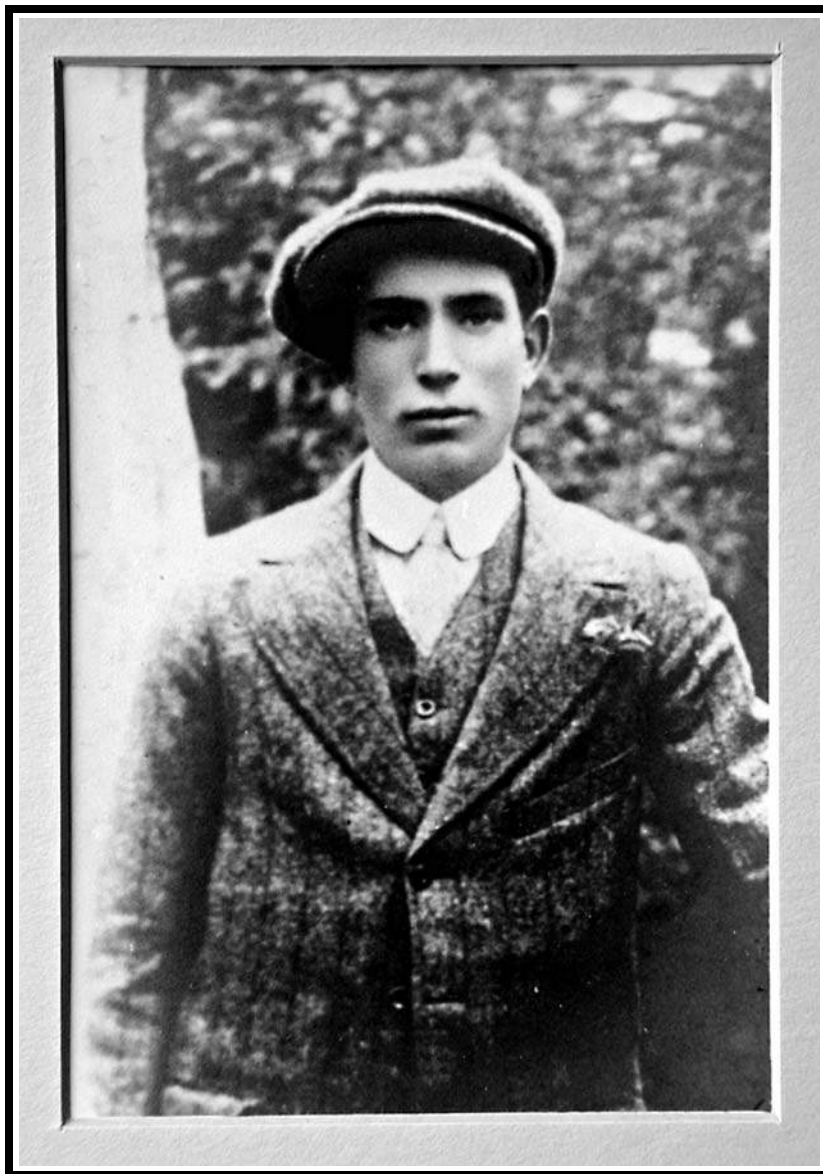
*During the First World War, the village of Lijssenthoek was situated on the main communication line between the Allied military bases in the rear and the Ypres battlefields. Close to the Front, but out of the extreme range of most German field artillery, it became a natural place to establish casualty clearing stations. The cemetery was first used by the French 15th Hopital D'Evacuation and in June 1915, it began to be used by casualty clearing stations of the Commonwealth forces. From April to August 1918, the casualty clearing stations fell back before the German advance and field ambulances (including a French ambulance) took their places. The cemetery contains 9,901 Commonwealth burials of the First World War, 24 being unidentified. There are 883 war graves of other nationalities, mostly French and German, 11 of these are unidentified. There is 1 Non World War burial here. The only concentration burials were 24 added to Plot XXXI in 1920 from isolated positions near Poperinghe and 17 added to Plot XXXII from St. Denijs Churchyard in 1981. Eight of the headstones are Special Memorials to men known to be buried in this cemetery, these are located together alongside Plot 32 near the Stone of Remembrance. The cemetery, designed by Sir Reginald Blomfield, is the second largest Commonwealth cemetery in Belgium. No. of Identified Casualties: 10755*

**Obituary – Evesham Journal & Four Shires Advertiser – April 1917**

Mr. W. T. Careless of Ravenhurst, Offenham, received official intimation on Wednesday morning that his eldest son, Lance-Corpl. William Careless, of the Worcesters, was killed in action in France on April 23. Lance-Corpl. Careless, who was a fine upstanding youth, was twenty-three at the outbreak of war, and his first experience of the trenches was on Christmas Eve, 1914. He took part in the famous charge at Neuve Chapelle on March 12, 1915, and here lost three of his pals, including his cousin, who also live at Offenham. He was wounded at the battle of Ypres on June 16, 1915, being injured with shrapnel in the left arm and side. After being treated at a hospital and convalescent home he was allowed a month's leave at home, and that was the only leave he had since he joined up. In October of that year he was sent to Egypt, and there joined the force which evacuated Gallipoli. In the spring of 1916 he returned to France, where he has been ever since, and where he had been in the thick of heavy fighting. He had been expecting leave ever since last October, but something always prevented his obtaining it. Previous to the war Lance-Corpl. Careless assisted his father. Mr. and Mrs. Careless's third son is in the army, being attached to the Mechanical Transport. He is at present in England.

**HOW LANCE-CORPL. WM. CARELESS DIED.**

Mr. W. T. Careless, of Offenham, has received the following letter dated May 15 from the officer in command of the platoon when his son Lance-Corpl. W. Careless was killed, as already reported: - "As you know he was in charge of a Lewis gun team, and was one the best and most reliable Lewis gun N.C.O.'s in the company. On the morning of April 23 the battalion attached, and it was during the advance that a shell killed you son and the officer commanding the company. From all the information I can get he must have lost his life instantaneously. Pt. Wells was in his team and saw it happen. I am very sorry indeed for you, but words are of little use in these times. He would be buried where he fell with the rest of the men who fell that day in front of Monchy le Preux."

*Monchy village, a relatively high and commanding position, was captured by Commonwealth forces on 11 April 1917. The cemetery was begun at once and continued in use as a front-line cemetery until the German offensive of March 1918, when it fell into their hands. It was recaptured by the Canadian Corps on 26 August and used again for a month. The graves are very closely identified with the divisions which fought on this front. There are now 581 Commonwealth servicemen of the First World War buried or commemorated in this cemetery. 58 of the burials are unidentified but there are special memorials to a number of casualties known to be buried among them. The cemetery was designed by Sir Edwin Lutyens.*

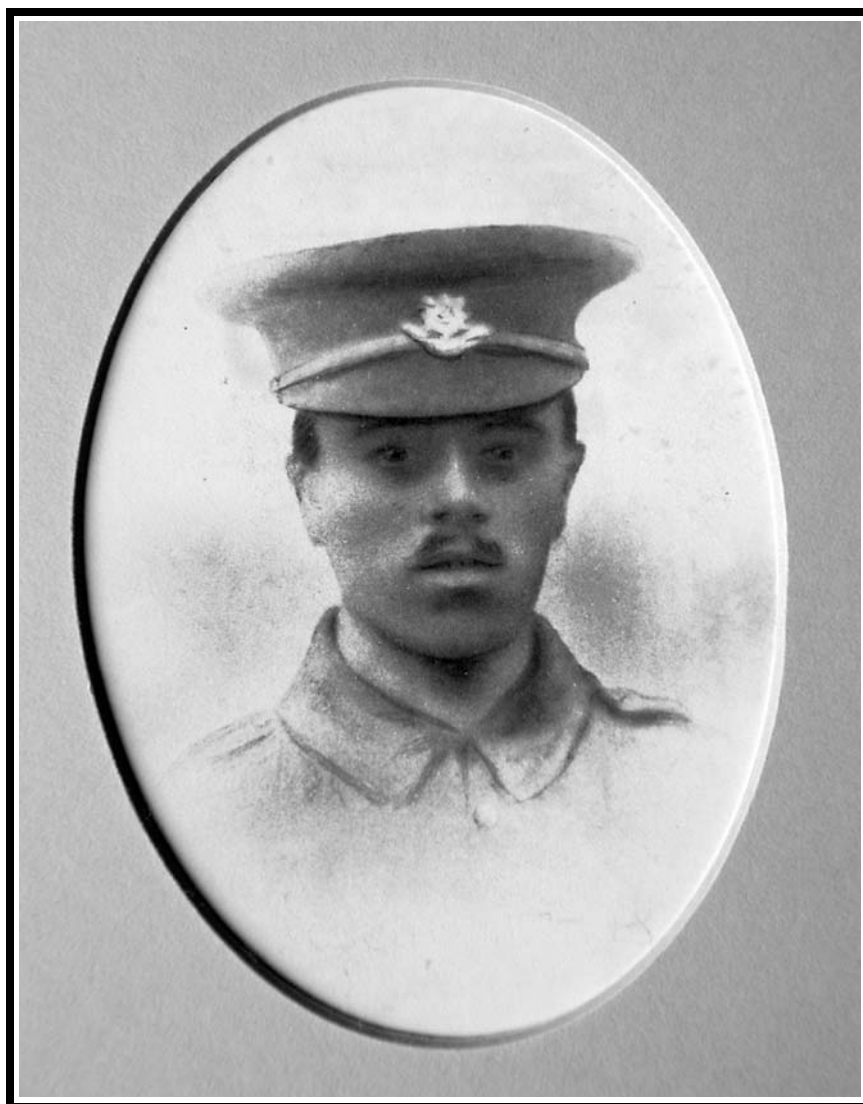
*The eight month campaign in Gallipoli was fought by Commonwealth and French forces in an attempt to force Turkey out of the war, to relieve the deadlock of the Western Front in France and Belgium, and to open a supply route to Russia through the Dardanelles and the Black Sea. The Allies landed on the peninsula on 25-26 April 1915; the 29th Division at Cape Helles in the south and the Australian and New Zealand Corps north of Gaba Tepe on the west coast, an area soon known as Anzac. On 6 August, further landings were made at Suvla, just north of Anzac, and the climax of the campaign came in early August when simultaneous assaults were launched on all three fronts. However, the difficult terrain and stiff Turkish resistance soon led to the stalemate of trench warfare. From the end of August, no further serious action was fought and the lines remained unchanged. The peninsula was successfully evacuated in December and early January 1916. The Helles Memorial serves the dual function of Commonwealth battle memorial for the whole Gallipoli campaign and place of commemoration for many of those Commonwealth servicemen who died there and have no known grave. The United Kingdom and Indian forces named on the memorial died in operations throughout the peninsula, the Australians at Helles. There are also panels for those who died or were buried at sea in Gallipoli waters. The memorial bears more than 21,000 names.*

**YPRES (MENIN GATE) MEMORIAL**

*The Menin Gate is one of four memorials to the missing in Belgian Flanders which cover the area known as the Ypres Salient. The Salient was formed during the First Battle of Ypres in October and November 1914, when a small British Expeditionary Force succeeded in securing the town before the onset of winter, pushing the German forces back to the Passchendaele Ridge. The Second Battle of Ypres began in April 1915 when the Germans released poison gas into the Allied lines north of Ypres. This was the first time gas had been used by either side and the violence of the attack forced an Allied withdrawal and a shortening of the line of defence. There was little more significant activity on this front until 1917, when in the Third Battle of Ypres an offensive was mounted by Commonwealth forces to divert German attention from a weakened French front further south. The initial attempt in June to dislodge the Germans from the Messines Ridge was a complete success, but the main assault north-eastward, which began at the end of July, quickly became a dogged struggle against determined opposition and the rapidly deteriorating weather. The campaign finally came to a close in November with the capture of Passchendaele. The German offensive of March 1918 met with some initial success, but was eventually checked and repulsed in a combined effort by the Allies in September. The battles of the Ypres Salient claimed many lives on both sides and it quickly became clear that the commemoration of members of the Commonwealth forces with no known grave would have to be divided between several different sites. The Menin Gate commemorates those of all Commonwealth nations, except New Zealand, who died in the Salient, in the case of United Kingdom casualties before 16 August 1917 (with some exceptions). Those United Kingdom and New Zealand servicemen who died after that date are named on the memorial at Tyne Cot, a site which marks the furthest point reached by Commonwealth forces in Belgium until nearly the end of the war. The YPRES (MENIN GATE) MEMORIAL now bears the names of more than 54,000 officers and men whose graves are not known.*

*The POZIERES MEMORIAL relates to the period of crisis in March and April 1918 when the Allied Fifth Army was driven back by overwhelming numbers across the former Somme battlefields, and the months that followed before the Advance to Victory, which began on 8 August 1918. The Memorial commemorates over 14,000 casualties of the United Kingdom and 300 of the South African Forces who have no known grave and who died on the Somme from 21 March to 7 August 1918. The Corps and Regiments most largely represented are The Rifle Brigade with over 600 names, The Durham Light Infantry with approximately 600 names, the Machine Gun Corps with over 500, The Manchester Regiment with approximately 500 and The Royal Horse and Royal Field Artillery with over 400 names. The memorial encloses POZIERES BRITISH CEMETERY, Plot II of which contains original burials of 1916, 1917 and 1918, carried out by fighting units and field ambulances. The remaining plots were made after the Armistice when graves were brought in from the battlefields immediately surrounding the cemetery, the majority of them of soldiers who died in the Autumn of 1916 during the latter stages of the Battle of the Somme, but a few represent the fighting in August 1918. There are now 2,758 Commonwealth servicemen buried or commemorated in this cemetery. 1,380 of the burials are unidentified but there are special memorials to 23 casualties known or believed to be buried among them. There is also 1 German soldier buried here. The cemetery and memorial were designed by W.H. Cowlshaw, with sculpture by Laurence A. Turner. The memorial was unveiled by Sir Horace Smith-Dorrien on 4 August 1930.*

**DEATH OF AN OFFENHAM SOLDIER** – The death took place at 3, Newtown Cottages, Offenham, of Pte. G. Jones, of the Grenadier Guards, on Thursday week. He was an old soldier, and was called up in August, 1914, and went to France in October, and was wounded on Christmas Eve of the same year at La Basse. He was sent to England, and was in hospital for several months. He returned to France and was wounded again at the battle of the Somme. He was sent back to England, but subsequently contracted tuberculosis in the throat, and had his discharge in May of this year and after a very painful illness he died on Thursday last. The funeral took place at South Littleton on Monday afternoon, the service being taken by the Rev. F. G. Ashworth, of Littleton. He was given military honours, seventeen soldiers being sent from Norton and Evesham. They fired three volleys over the grave. Mrs. Hemming of North Littleton played the Dead March as the body left the church. The bearers were Messrs. C. Emms, D. Emms, A. Harrison, H. Moore, O. Allchurch and J. Knight. The mourners were Mrs. Jones (widow), Messrs. E. and A. Jones (sons). Mr. and Mrs. Jones (mother and father), Mr. A. Jones and Mrs. Knight (brother and sister), Mr. and Mrs. Knight (brother-in-law and sister), Mr. and Mrs E. Jones (brother and sister-in-law). Mr. S. Jones (brother), Mrs. Shelton and Mrs. Mumford (sisters-in-law), Mr. A. Harrison (nephew), Mr. E. Knight (brother-in-law), Mr. W. Smith (brother-in-law), and Mrs. J. Woodward (friend). Some beautiful wreaths were sent, including one from the Offenham Soldiers and Sailors' Garment Fund. He leaves a widow and four children.

*Oxford Road was the name given to a road running behind the support trenches, from a point west of the village of Wieltje south-eastwards to the Potijze-Zonnebeke road. Plot I is the original Oxford Road Cemetery and was used by the units fighting on this front from August 1917 to April 1918. In October 1917, another cemetery, known as Oxford Road Cemetery No.2, was started close by and now forms Plot V of the cemetery as it appears today. After the Armistice, Plots II, III and IV were added when scattered graves from the battlefields east and south-east of Ypres (now Ieper) were brought into the cemetery. There are now 851 Commonwealth casualties of the First World War buried or commemorated in this cemetery. 297 of the burials are unidentified and special memorials commemorate three casualties known to have been buried in the cemetery, but whose graves could not be located. The cemetery was designed by Sir Reginald Blomfield.*

**MILITARY MEDALIST KILLED.**

Mrs. A. Marshall, of Court-lane, Offenham has received information that her son, Pte. Walter J. Marshall of the Coldstream Guards, M.M., was killed in action on December 1. Capt. A. C. Wilkins, writing to the deceased's soldier's mother, gives striking testimony of the high esteem in which her son was held. He writes; "I cannot say how sorry I am to inform you that your son Walter was killed in action on 1st December. Never have I had a better soldier or a better man under me. As a soldier he was fearless; as a man he was an example to us all. I think I knew his best of all my men. He was actually with me throughout the attack on July 31<sup>st</sup>, and I really loved him. I shall miss him almost as much as you will. He leaves a gap in my company which can never be filled. Always cheerful and willing, with a heart of a lion. You have suffered a very great loss. So, too, have I. It is a consolation that he was killed instantly by a shell, and you may rest assured that he felt no pain. The fact that he has so recently returned from leave will, I fear, accentuate the blow, but it may be a comfort that you saw his on the eve of his death. The action in which he was killed was totally unexpected by us all, but there can be no doubt that the attack of the Guards that day save what might have been a serious disaster. So that your son's life was not altogether thrown away. Two of his friend were killed with him. But really it is a privilege to die for England, and you may ever be proud of your soldier son. He was my ideal as a Coldstreamer. If the British Army were half its size, but composed entirely of boys like yours, the war would have been over by now." We published a photograph of Pte. Marshall in our issue of September 8 last on the occasion of his being awarded the Military Medal for gallantry. He was awarded the decoration at the time his officer won the Military Cross. Pte. Marshall was running despatches. He is the first Offenham lad to be decorated. He joined the Coldstream Guards in November 1915, and went out to France in August of last year. He took part in the great offensive of July. Before joining the Army he was for several years at work in Birmingham.





*The CAMBRAI MEMORIAL commemorates more than 7,000 servicemen of the United Kingdom and South Africa who died in the Battle of Cambrai in November and December 1917 and whose graves are not known. Sir Douglas Haig described the object of the Cambrai operations as the gaining of a 'local success by a sudden attack at a point where the enemy did not expect it' and to some extent they succeeded. The proposed method of assault was new, with no preliminary artillery bombardment. Instead, tanks would be used to break through the German wire, with the infantry following under the cover of smoke barrages. The attack began early in the morning of 20 November 1917 and initial advances were remarkable. However, by 22 November, a halt was called for rest and reorganisation, allowing the Germans to reinforce. From 23 to 28 November, the fighting was concentrated almost entirely around Bournon Wood and by 29 November, it was clear that the Germans were ready for a major counter attack. During the fierce fighting of the next five days, much of the ground gained in the initial days of the attack was lost. For the Allies, the results of the battle were ultimately disappointing but valuable lessons were learnt about new strategies and tactical approaches to fighting. The Germans had also discovered that their fixed lines of defence, no matter how well prepared, were vulnerable. The Cambrai Memorial was designed by Harold Chalton Bradshaw with sculpture by Charles S. Jagger. It was unveiled by Lieut-General Sir Louis Vaughan on 4 August 1930. The memorial stands on a terrace at one end of LOUVERVAL MILITARY CEMETERY. The chateau at Louverval, was taken by the 56th Australian Infantry Battalion at dawn on 2 April 1917. The hamlet stayed in Allied hands until the 51st (Highland) Division was driven from it on 21 March 1918 during the great German advance, and it was retaken in the following September. Parts of Rows B and C of the cemetery were made between April and December 1917 and in 1927, graves were brought in from Louverval Chateau Cemetery, which had been begun by German troops in March 1918 and used by Commonwealth forces in September and October 1918. The cemetery now contains 124 First World War burials.*

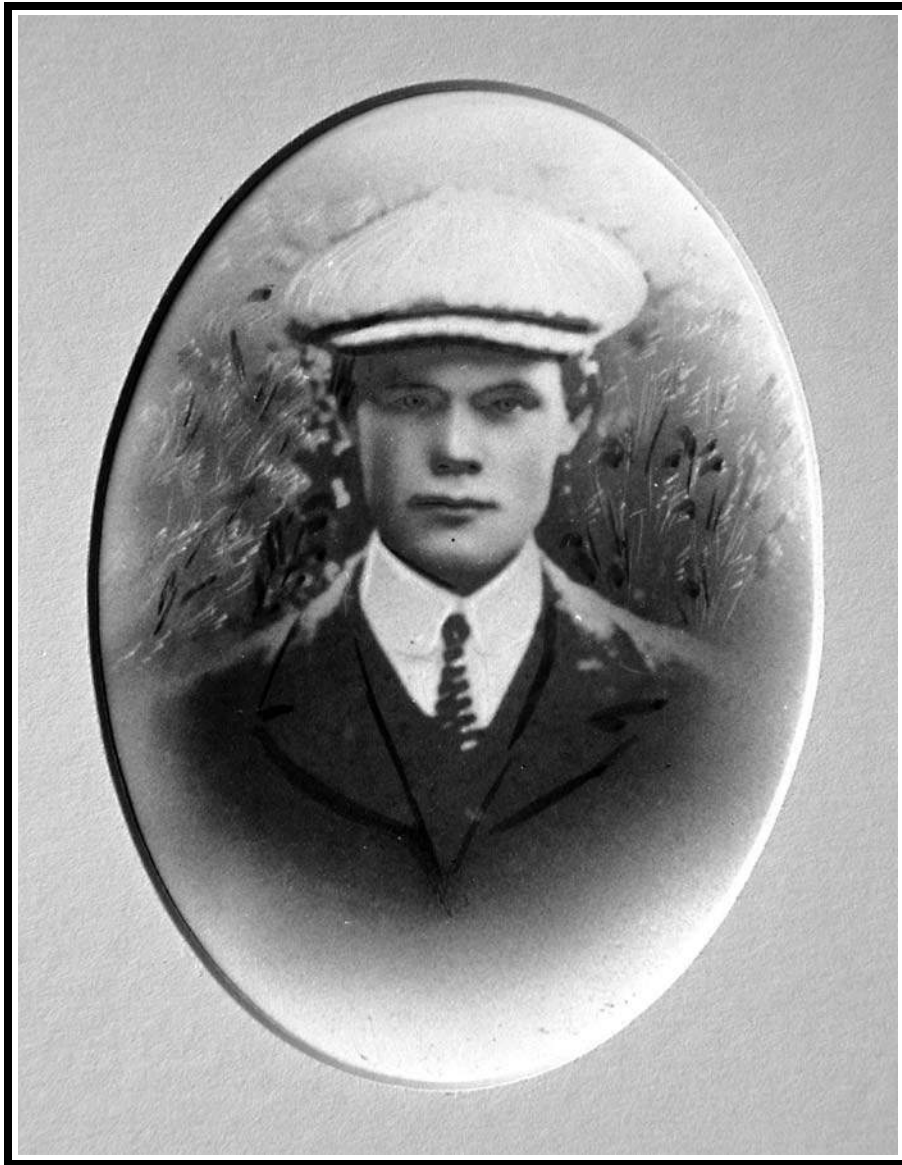

**ANOTHER OFFENHAM LAD KILLED**

Mr. and Mrs. A. Marshall, of Offenham, have received official news that their eldest son, Pte. W. H. Marshall, of the Coldstream Guards, was killed in Action on August 27. He joined the Army in March, 1917, and went to France in December of the same year. Before joining the Army he was in the Birmingham City Police Force. This makes the second son Mr. and Mrs. Marshall have lost out of the same battalion and another son is still serving in France.



The 7th Division attacked Croisilles in March 1917 and took it on 2 April. It was lost on 21 March 1918 and recaptured by the 56th (London) Division on the following 28 August, after heavy fighting. Plots I and II of the cemetery, were made between April 1917 and March 1918 and the rest was formed after the Armistice, when graves were brought in from the neighbouring battlefields and from some smaller burial grounds. The majority of the soldiers buried in the cemetery belonged to the Guards, 7th and 21st Divisions. Croisilles British Cemetery now contains 1,171 Commonwealth burials and commemorations of the First World War. 647 of the burials are unidentified but there are special memorials to 14 casualties buried among them. Other special memorials commemorate casualties buried in HENDECOURT-LES-CAGNICOURT Communal Cemetery in 1917, whose graves were destroyed by shell fire. The cemetery also contains the graves of six Commonwealth airmen of the Second World War and 18 German war graves.

**Military Funeral.** – The funeral of the late Corporal R. Smith, R.F.A., took place on Wednesday at Offenham. A large number of mourners followed to the grave. The chief mourners were Mrs. Smith (Shipston-on-Stour, mother), Mrs. James Nightingale, Mrs. F. Cresswell, Mrs. Clements, Mrs T. Smith, Mrs. A. E. Smith, Miss A. M. Smith (sisters and sisters-in-law), Mr. A. E. Smith, Mr. W. Smith, Mr. Richard Smith, Mr. Tim Smith, and Mr. Jim Smith (brothers), Miss D. Nightingale (niece). The deceased joined the local branch of the Comrades of the Great War at its formation, and was followed by about 20 of the members. The coffin was covered with the Union Jack, and was borne by Comrades H. Drinkwater, W. Marshall, J. English, H. Nightingale, W. Nightingale, and R. Nightingale. The Service was conducted by the Rev. W. C. Allsebrook, R.D. (Vicar of Badsey), Mr. Baynon was at the organ, and appropriate hymns were sung. At the graveside “The Last Post” was sounded by Buglers Alcock and Turner. Many beautiful flowers were sent by relatives and friends. The late Corp. Smith had served his time in India, and was awaiting a home draft in 1914 when war broke out. He was sent to France, and was present at Mons, and came through the retreat unscathed. He afterwards took part in the attempted relief of Kut. From there he returned to France, and served until his demobilisation in 1919.

*On 3 September 1943 the Allies invaded the Italian mainland, the invasion coinciding with an armistice made with the Italians who then re-entered the war on the Allied side. Progress through southern Italy was rapid despite stiff resistance, but the advance was checked for some months at the German winter defensive position known as the Gustav Line. Operations in January 1944 landed troops behind the German lines at Anzio, but a breakthrough was not achieved until 18 May when, after fierce fighting, Cassino finally fell to the Allies. Rome was taken on 3 June as the German withdrawal continued. The cemetery was started shortly afterwards and was used mainly for burials from the occupying garrison, but a few graves were brought in from the surrounding country, and some soldiers and airmen who died as prisoners of war in Rome are also buried there. Rome War Cemetery contains 426 Commonwealth burials of the Second World War.*

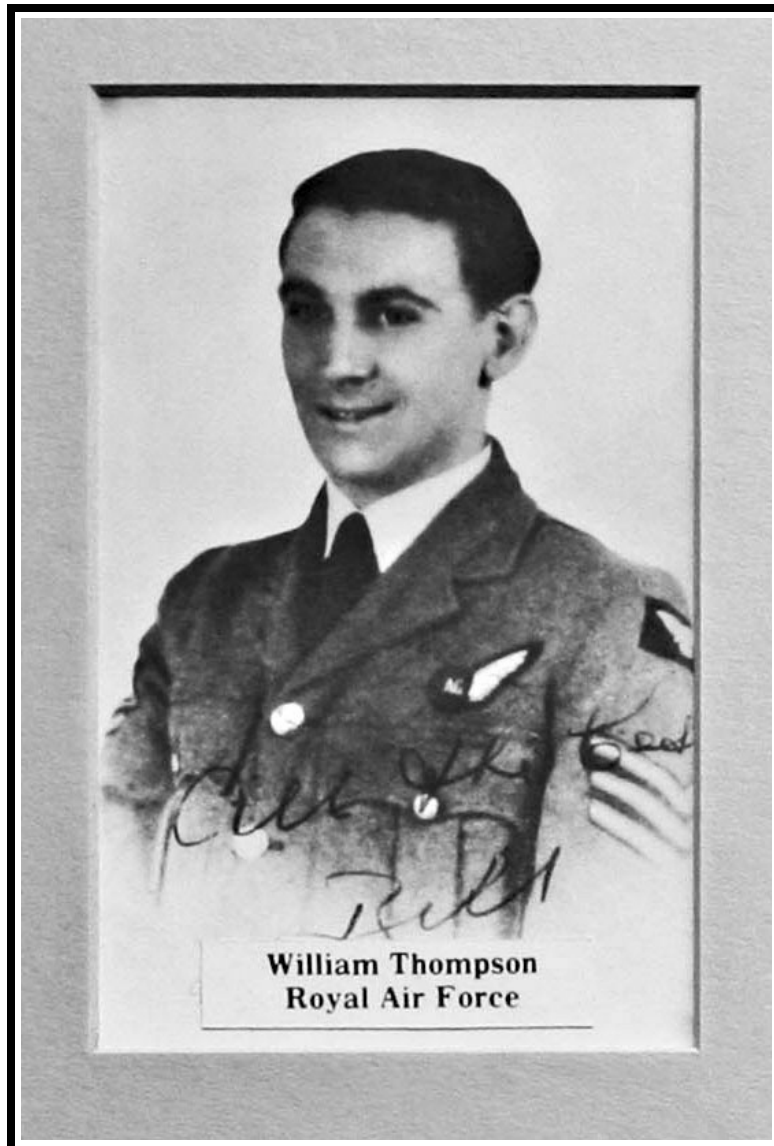
*The Allied offensive in north-western Europe began with the Normandy landings of 6 June 1944. The BAYEUX MEMORIAL stands opposite the cemetery and bears the names of more than 1,800 men of the Commonwealth land forces who died in the early stages of the campaign and have no known grave. They died during the landings in Normandy, during the intense fighting in Normandy itself, and during the advance to the River Seine in August. There was little actual fighting in Bayeux although it was the first French town of importance to be liberated. BAYEUX WAR CEMETERY is the largest Commonwealth cemetery of the Second World War in France and contains burials brought in from the surrounding districts and from hospitals that were located nearby. The cemetery contains 4,144 Commonwealth burials of the Second World War, 338 of them unidentified. There are also 505 war graves of other nationalities, the majority German.*

*The British Expeditionary Force was involved in the later stages of the defence of Belgium following the German invasion in May 1940, and suffered many casualties in covering the withdrawal to Dunkirk. Commonwealth forces did not return until September 1944, but in the intervening years, many airmen were shot down or crashed in raids on strategic objectives in Belgium, or while returning from missions over Germany. Most of those Commonwealth servicemen buried at Oostduinkerke Communal Cemetery died in the heavy fighting along the Nieuport-Veurne-Dunkirk Canal, while covering the retreat of the British Expeditionary Force to Dunkirk in May 1940. The cemetery contains a plot of 180 Commonwealth burials of the Second World War, 31 of them unidentified.*

The Air Forces Memorial at Runnymede commemorates by name over 20,000 airmen who were lost in the Second World War during operations from bases in the United Kingdom and North and Western Europe, and who have no known graves. They served in Bomber, Fighter, Coastal, Transport, Flying Training and Maintenance Commands, and came from all parts of the Commonwealth. .*

*Lichens and moss on the gravestones. Lichens in graveyard and on gravestones are important for several reasons. Graveyard are places which have a long history as places of peace and tranquillity. Most have remained relatively undisturbed for centuries and that means that the surface which the lichens have colonised have also remained undisturbed. This results in a profusion and abundance of species which may not be evident in the surrounding countryside. Indeed, graveyards are often the last refuge of lichen species whose natural habitat has been disrupted by changes in agricultural practices, or destroyed by development. The walls of ruined monuments, churches and particularly gravestones often provide habitat for lichen species where no natural habitat exists in the surrounding area.*





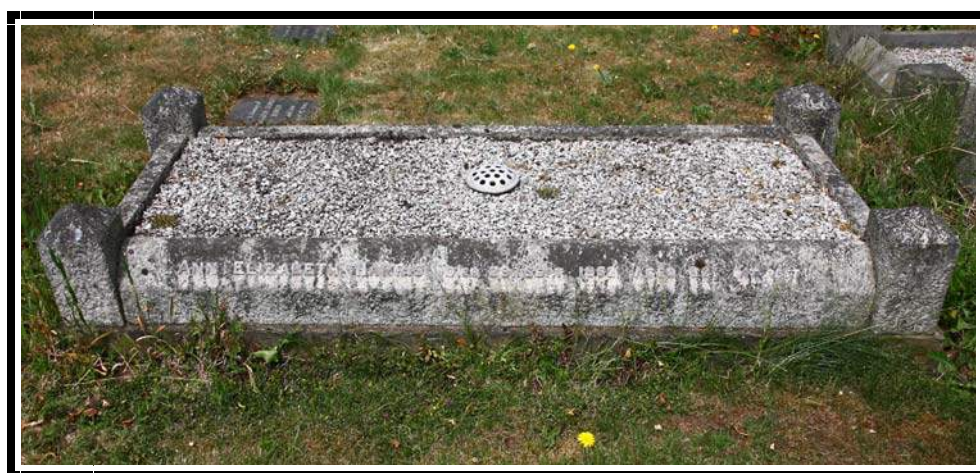
